  occasioned to persons, property, spectators or competitors. It is a condition of entry that each person shall
  hold the event organising committee blameless, and indemnify it against legal proceedings arising from any
  accident.
- Arndell Anglican College accepts **NO** responsibility for lost property.
- All competitors, spectators and officials must conform to the code of conduct set by Arndell Anglican College.
- An emergency evacuation plan is in place, and relevant officials will implement the plan if required.
- Parking is at your own risk.
- Medical personnel will be available on the day.
- NO DOGS ALLOWED at the showground for the duration of the event.
- · Only competitors who have made prior arrangement may use the stable and camping area.
- In the event of wet weather there will be no refund, the event will be RESCHEDULED. Enquiries: www.arndell.nsw.edu.au/content/equestrian-0.
- Tying of horses to the show ring boundary fence is NOT permitted.
- Please obey all signage on the ground and note the HORSE FREE areas:
  - The sand arenas
  - The canteen and car only parking.

#### RULES AND REGULATIONS

- Day Insurance available for \$15 to non EA members
- Entries are at the discretion of the Arndell Equestrian Committee.
- One horse/One rider (does not apply to siblings sharing a horse, however, classes will not wait for riders or horses).
- A rider may only use one horse for the day. If a separate horse is to be used for sporting a second entry fee
  must be paid.
- Horses must only be ridden by the student competitor on the carnival day. No other rider is permitted to ride
  on the day.
- No official gear check will be performed. It is the team manager/rider/parent/guardian's responsibility to ensure equipment is safe and meets **ALL** Equestrian Australia/Federation Standards.
- Only students currently enrolled in school are eligible to compete.
- Classes will not be announced, competitors should remain in the ring to avoid missing a class.
- If a competitor misses a class they are not permitted to ride in another year's class.
- Protests are to be addressed to the OC only and within 30 minutes, no rider is to be approached. Protests attract a \$50 fee which will be refunded if the protest is upheld. The OC's decision is final.
- Judges decision is final. Judges may disqualify any mount which they consider unsuitable for a school event.
   Judges may request rider ring changes where they deem it necessary for safety.
- The committee reserves the right to split or combine classes where necessary
- Late entries will attract a \$20 late fee per rider
- Warming up may only be performed in the designated areas or large grass areas, away from floats. Young children and inexperienced riders must be supervised while warming up.
- Lunging is ONLY permitted on grass areas away from floats.
- · No horses in the camping area.
- Changes made on the day will incur a \$50 fee per rider.
- AAC will only accept on-line entries for this event.
- Enter on line: www.nominate.com.au On-line entries not paid by the closing date will be deleted.
- Entries are taken on a first in basis. Telephone/Late entries will not be accepted.
- Any withdrawal of a horse/rider after close of entries for any reason/medical/veterinary grounds or are classed as being unfit to compete, shall be refunded 50% of class entry fees, less the \$5.00 administration fee. This will be refunded only if a medical/veterinary certificate is received within 48 hours of the notification.

#### DRESS

- No standing or fixed martingales, no side reins/draw reins. Only dummy spurs allowed.
- · Heeled riding boots, school jumper in school colour. NO blazers or riding coats permitted.
- Gaiters/top boots are only to be worn by riders over 17 years of age.

#### RING DESCRIPTIONS

#### PRIMARY:

**PRIMARY BEGINNERS** (Led/Assisted): Primary students in Kindergarten – Year 6 who cannot walk and trot unassisted. Riders must remain on the lead at ALL times, when mounted.

Leading rein to be attached to cavesson noseband, the lead held by the handler in the left hand whilst walking beside the rider. Should the mount make a sudden movement the right hand is there to steady the child and perhaps prevent a fall. Walking and trotting only in any event in the beginners ring including the sporting. Beginners ring is in a roped off area.

**PRIMARY NOVICE** (Unled/Unassisted): Primary Students in Kindergarten – Year 6 who cannot canter safely. Novice riders are not permitted to canter for the duration of the carnival. All show ring work, including workouts, will be done at a walk and trot only. Sporting events are only at walk and trot as well. Primary novice ring will be in a roped off area.

**PRIMARY INTERMEDIATE:** Primary students in Kindergarten – Year 6 who can canter safely unassisted and are able to control their mount when cantering. **No Double Bridles to be worn**.

**PRIMARY OPEN:** Primary Students in Kindergarten – Year 6 who have previously won a riding class in the intermediate ring at a previous gymkhana, or at a similar or higher level, or who compete at shows in open competition.

#### SENIOR: Note: There is NO senior beginner ring.

**SENIOR NOVICE** (Unled/Unassisted): Senior Students in Year 7 – Year 12 who cannot canter safely. Novice riders are not permitted to canter for the duration of the carnival. All show ring work, including workouts, will be done at a walk and trot only. Sporting events are only at walk and trot as well.

**SENIOR INTERMEDIATE:** Senior students in Year 7 – Year 12 who can canter safely unassisted and are able to control their mount when cantering. **No Double Bridles to be worn.** 

**SENIOR OPEN:** Senior Students in Year 7 – Year 12 who have previously won a riding class in the intermediate ring at a previous gymkhana, or at a similar or higher level, or who compete at shows in open competition.

NOTE: Any riders who have won at a riding class at a previous gymkhana (or similar or higher level) or who competes at shows in open competition MUST compete in the open ring.

#### **CLASS DESCRIPTIONS:**

**Best Presented:** Judged on the clean, neat and tidy appearance of horse, rider and saddlery. Judged mounted in ring – no workout required.

Handler: Judged on the rider's ability to present their horse/pony on the ground.

Rider: Judged on the position and riding ability of the rider.

Active Rider: Judged on the rider and includes a small jump in the workout.

**Best Exhibit Junior and Senior**: (Novice rings) Judged on the horses confirmation, manners, paces and education.

**Open Hack**: Intermediate/Open riders only. Judged on the horses confirmation, manners, paces and education.

**Hunter Hack:** Intermediate/Open riders only. For horses with more bone substance, judged on horses confirmation, manners, paces and education.

NOTE: Riders are only eligible to compete in Open Hack OR Hunter Hack. NOT both classes. Riders are to nominate prior to the event.

**Pairs:** In order to find a pair from your school you find it necessary to use a rider from a different year group, it is permissible as long as the riders are from the same competition ring level (eg. both have competed in the Junior Intermediate Ring for the 2013 Carnival) younger rider competes in a higher year division. Riders are not permitted to ride a different ring for this event.

### CODES OF CONDUCT

#### **Code of Conduct for Participants**

- Abide by the principles of the FEI Code of Conduct for the Welfare of the Horse
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of fellow participants, parents / coaches, officials, volunteers and spectators
- Do not tolerate acts of aggression
- Respect the talent, potential and development of fellow competitors
- Care for and respect the equipment provided to you as part of the competition
- Conduct yourself in a positive manner relating to language, temper and punctuality, be courteous
- Maintain high personal behaviour standards at all times
- Abide by the rules and respect the decision of the official, making all appeals through the formal process and respecting the final decision
- Be honest in your attitude and preparation to training. Work equally hard for yourself and your team
- Cooperate with parents / coaches to adequately prepare you for competition
- Understand the repercussions if you breach the codes of conduct, as they apply to you.

#### Code of Conduct for Parents / Carer

- · Respect the rights, dignity and worth of others
- · Remember that your child participates in sport for their own enjoyment, not yours
- · Focus on your child's efforts and performance rather than winning or losing
- Never ridicule or yell at your child or other children for making a mistake or losing a competition
- Show appreciation for good performance by all competitors (including opposing competitors)
- Demonstrate a high degree of individual responsibility especially when dealing with or in the vicinity of persons under the age of 18 years, as your words and actions are an example
- · Respect officials' decisions and teach children to do likewise
- Do not physically or verbally abuse or harass anyone associated with the sport (competitor, parent / carer, officials etc)
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every young person regardless of their gender, ability, or cultural background
- Be a positive role model
- Understand the repercussions if you breach the codes of conduct, as they apply to you.

#### **Code of Conduct for Spectators**

- Respect the decisions of officials and teach young people to do the same
- Never ridicule or scold a competitor for making a mistake. Positive comments are motivational
- Condemn the use of violence in any form, whether it is by other spectators, coaches, officials, volunteers or competitors
- Show respect for your team's opponents. Without them there would be no competition
- Do not use violence, harassment or abuse in any form (that is, do not use foul language, sledge or harass competitors, parents / carers, coaches, officials or other spectators)
- Respect the rights, dignity and worth of every person regardless of their gender, ability, cultural or background
- Understand the repercussions if you breach the codes of conduct, as they apply to you.

#### **Failure to Meet the Codes**

Failure to meet the codes of conduct, as they apply to you, and as determined by the Headmaster of Arndell Anglican College, or his delegate, may result in your and / or your student/s exclusion from the event and / or future events hosted by Arndell Anglican College.
