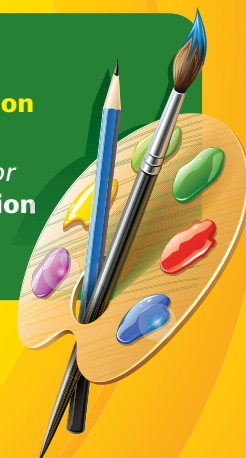

- 1 Entries can be mailed to The Secretary, Post Office Box 401 Ballarat 3353, or online www.ballaratshow.org.au via www.nominate.com.au
- 2 Entries must be submitted on the proper entry form (downloadable from www.ballaratshow.org.au) or available at the end of this booklet.
- 3 Nominate is new for 2017. They have a help desk on 0731189555.
- 4 Correct entry fees must accompany entry forms. (GST Included in the stated entry fees. Cheques payable to BAPS). Entries received after closing date will not be processed.
- 5 Please write your entries clearly and supply all the information asked for. When entering animals, please give all details requested on the entry form.
- 6 Please ensure your correct postal address is given for confirmation of entries if required.
- 7 Prize money in the Hand Crafts & Flowers will be paid at the time of collection. All other sections will be paid as per the section details.
- 8 Exhibits may only be collected as stated or by arrangement with the Chief Steward of the relevant Sections or the Secretary. Times for collection detailed in the individual Section Regulations.
- 9 Carefully read the rules and instructions relating to your particular section entry to make sure that your entries are entered correctly in the appropriate classes.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

- General Entries must be made in WRITING on the Entry Forms, supplied by the Society & must be lodged with the Director at the Directors Office, Ballarat Showgrounds. The age of all exhibits of all livestock must be set forth in each entry.
- At the time of entry, the class & section in which it is intended to exhibit must be stated & signed by or for the Exhibitor. A Ticket for each exhibit must accompany the exhibit when placed, & no exhibit will be received without such ticket. The exhibitors must take proper care of the entry tickets.
- The Society invites the exhibition of any other articles or animals than those enumerated, & certificates may be awarded by the Judges to those considered deserving, but no certificates can be awarded by the Judges for extra exhibits if the prize list contains a section in which the same can compete.
- Full entry fee (GST Inc) must be paid at the time of lodging all entries & once paid will not be refunded.
- The Committee is empowered to demand from any exhibitor a statutory declaration to the effect that any or all of his exhibits are made in conformity with these regulations, & in the event of the Committee being of the opinion that any exhibit is not so entered, it is authorised either to withhold the prize, if any, awarded to such exhibit, or to give it to the next highest competitor.
- The Judges may award a second or third prize instead of a first one, or may withhold a prize altogether where there is only one exhibit or where the exhibits are not considered worthy.
- No person shall be an exhibitor in section or sections in which he/she is a Judge or Steward.
- The decision of the Judges shall be final & without appeal.
- Section tickets DO NOT admit exhibitor to the ground, & must be produced with each exhibit. NO EXHIBITOR PASSES WILL BE ISSUED.
- Any prize or prizes awarded by the Society at any of its exhibitions, & left unclaimed for a period of four months from the date of award, may be forfeited & cancelled by the Executive of this Society.
- No industrial exhibit to be finally removed from the Exhibition before the hour of 4pm, on the last day of the Show, & no vehicle shall be admitted into the Showgrounds before 5pm, on that date for the removal of exhibits.
- Every possible care will be taken of all exhibits, but no responsibility will be incurred by the Society. All Exhibits left in the Society's yard for a period of one month may be sold by the Society to defray expenses.
- Only Authorised Persons will be admitted to the Judging Areas during Judging of any section, & it shall be the duty of the Stewards to prevent any persons interfering with the Judges, & if necessary, order the removal of such offender from Judging area.
- Any infringement of these regulations will disqualify the exhibitor from taking a prize.
- All competitors & exhibitors shall take part in competitions or attend at their exhibitions at their own risk; and in any case if any such exhibit, whilst on the Society's grounds, shall cause or be the cause of injury or damage to other exhibits, competitors or exhibitors, or to the person or property of any member of the Society or the general public, the owner or owners of such exhibits shall indemnify & keep indemnified the Society, its officers & members, property & effects from & against all damages, costs, claims expenses, or liabilities incurred in connection with such exhibits.
- Any protest made against exhibitors for infringement of the rules connected with the Annual Exhibition must be lodged with the Director before the hour of 4pm, on the last day of the Show, & such protest shall be dealt with at the Show by the Disputes Committee or at some adjourned meeting of the Disputes Committee. Each protest must be accompanied with a deposit of \$20, which sum shall be forfeited by the protester if the protest be found, after due investigation to be frivolous.
- The Show will be open to Members who have paid their subscriptions for the current financial year on presenting the membership ticket at the entrance gate. The public will be admitted on each day of the Show from the advertised time & upon payment of the applicable charge.
- In cases of dispute as to the construction of any of these regulations, the same shall be determined by the Executive of the Society.
- Entries to the Show are accepted subject to the rules & regulations & bylaws of the Society & of the Show.
- The entrant agrees to be bound by those rules & regulations & by-laws.
- The entrant also agrees to abide by all decisions made by the Society, by the Group with which it is affiliated or by VAS Ltd pursuant to those rules & regulations & by-laws.
- No decision so made shall be called into question by the entrant before any court or other body (whether or not of a similar nature to a court) whatsoever.

23. The Prize Ribbons will be recognised as follows: First Prize, Blue; Second Prize Red; Third Prize, White; Special Prize, Green.
24. All trophies of a perpetual nature will be retained at the Showgrounds.
25. In compliance with Government Johnes Disease regulations cattle, sheep and goat exhibitors must have clean exhibits and animal transportation and supply their own forage and water containers.
26. Unless otherwise specified, all exhibits other than arena competitions must on the day of entry, be the property of the exhibitor.
27. Competitors in all Sections (including Arenas) will compete at their own responsibility and risk.
28. The Ballarat A & P Society will be taking photographs which may be used on the Society website, facebook and other advertising etc. Your attendance is considered permission for the images to be used.

SAFETY REGULATIONS FOR EXHIBITORS & SITEHOLDERS

1. DUTY OF CARE

All competitors have a Duty of Care to avoid exposing themselves and others to unsafe situations that could lead to property damage or personal injury.

All persons must comply with any reasonable request of BAPS representatives.

2. Direction of Ballarat Agricultural & Pastoral Society Inc. (BAPS)

Competitors must comply with any reasonable request of BAPS representatives

3. FIRST AID

During the Ballarat Show, St Johns Ambulance Vic provides First Aid Services

4. BAPS EMERGENCY FACILITIES

Fire fighting and other emergency equipment must not be removed or used for any other purpose. Missing or unserviceable equipment should be reported to Administration immediately.

5. HAZARD & INCIDENT REPORTING

Competitors must notify the Office Administration immediately of any hazards detected or incidents. Hazards or incidents are any situation that could result or has resulted in:

- a) the injury, illness or death of any person or animal
- b) the damage, destruction or loss of property

6. WASTE DISPOSAL

All waste, including liquids must be disposed of responsibly. Storm drains must not be used for the disposal of waste.

7. HOUSEKEEPING

All areas must be kept in clean and tidy order with clearly defined and available access and exit routes at all times. Build up of combustible waste must be avoided.

8. SLIPS, TRIPS & FALLS

Care must be taken to minimize trip hazards and obstacles that people may walk into. Avoid laying unprotected cables or pipes on or above paths, walkways or roads.

9. MEDIA COMMENTS

The Secretary coordinates media comment about matters involving BAPS or the Showgrounds.

10. SMOKING

Smoking is not permitted at the Ballarat Showgrounds.

11. ELECTRICAL EQUIPMENT

- a) Competitors should supply their own "Safety Switch" (RCD) for installation at each power outlet they use.
 - b) Extension cords must be earthed and all electrical appliances must be earthed or double insulated. Appliances must be in a sound working order.
 - c) The use of double adaptors is strictly prohibited. Power boards must be fitted with current overload protection
 - d) Radiant electric or gas heaters are prohibited.
 - e) Light sockets must not be used for any other purpose than for lighting.
 - f) No naked flame permitted
- All Exhibitor electrical items (including leads) must have a current tag.

All females must be provided with effective halters and be thoroughly broken to lead.

Each exhibitor is required to see that each of their exhibits is securely tethered in its stall. All exhibitors of beef cattle must provide neck straps or neck ropes, as well as halters for tethering their cattle.

Every poll bull and every wholly or partially dehorned bull entered in beef and dual purpose sections must be securely tethered by an effective headstall in addition to a nose ring or neck strap or neck rope.

If, in the opinion of the Senior Steward, any exhibits of stock are deemed to be dangerous, the owner of such exhibit or exhibits shall immediately, upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or exhibits from the Society's grounds.

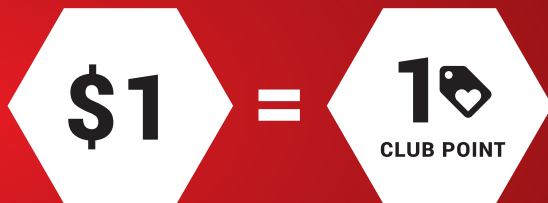

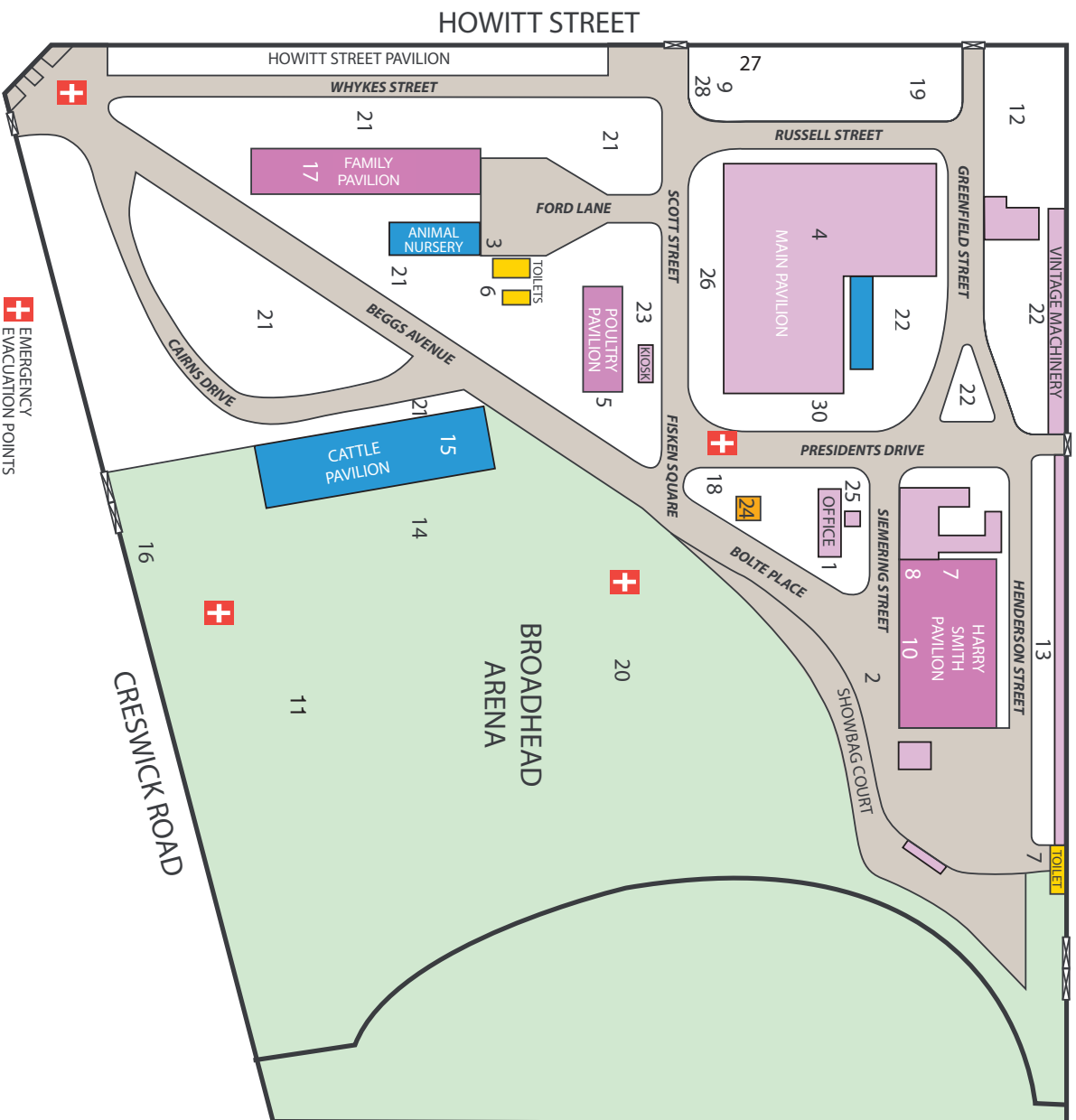



Recipe

Ingredients:

- 375g Mixed Fruit
- 3/4 cup brown sugar
- 1 tsp mixed spice
- 1/2 cup water
- 125g butter
- 1/2 tsp bicarbonate of soda
- 2 eggs lightly beaten
- 2 tablespoons marmalade
- 1 cup self-raising flour
- 1 cup plain flour
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup sherry

Method

1. Place the mixed fruit, spice, sugar, water and butter in a large saucepan and bring to the boil.
2. Simmer gently for 3 minutes, then remove from stove add bicarb soda and allow to cool.
3. Add the sherry, eggs and marmalade, mixing well.
4. Fold in the sifted dry ingredients then place in a greased and lined 20 cm round cake tin.
5. Bake in a moderately slow oven for 1 1/2 hours, or until cooked when tested.

- 1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/2 cup (80g) brown sugar
- 1/2 cup (125 mls) oil
- 1/2 cup (125 mls) golden syrup
- 3 eggs
- 1 teaspoon vanilla essence
- 1/2 cup chopped walnuts

Method

1. Pre heat oven to 170C (a moderate oven). Grease a 20cm (base) round cake pan lightly with oil, and line with non-stick baking paper. Peel and grate the carrots and set aside.
2. Sift the flours, bicarbonate of soda and cinnamon into a large bowl.
3. Put the brown sugar, oil, golden syrup, eggs and vanilla in a separate bowl. Use a balloon whisk to mix until combined.
4. Pour the oil mixture into the dry ingredients. Use a wooden spoon to stir gently until just combined.
5. Stir in the grated carrot and walnuts.
6. Pour the mixture into the pan and bake for 1 hour. Set aside for 5 minutes, before turning out onto a wire rack to cool completely.

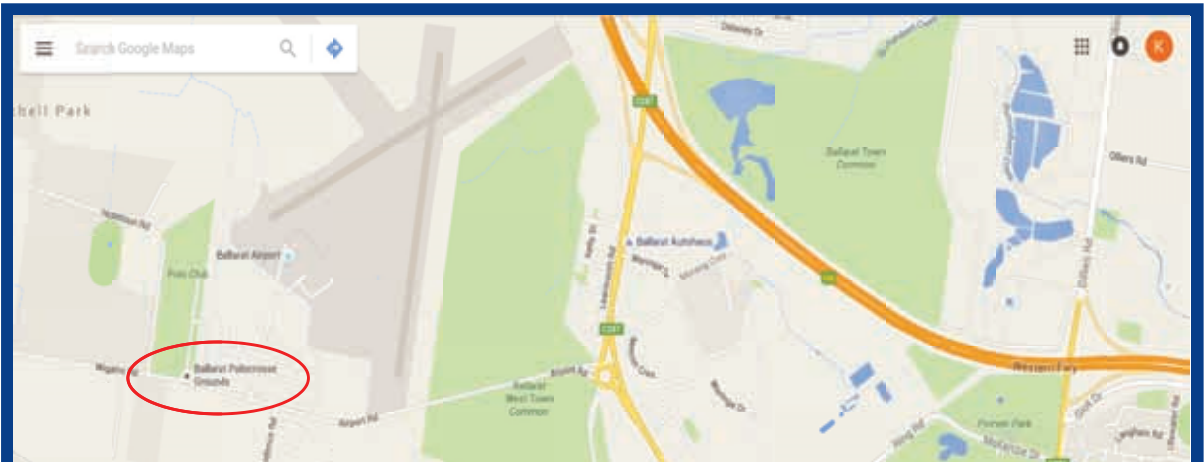

NOTE 4: Faecal 350: A test of 350 representative sheep over 2 years of age (or all sheep over 2 years of age in smaller flocks) by Pooled Faecal Culture (PFC) or equivalent test in pools of up to 50 sheep. The sheep must have been on the property for at least 2 years.

Abattoir 500: At least 500 sheep, over 2 years of age, have been submitted to an abattoir in the past 24 months, in 1 or more lots, have been examined and all found negative for OJD. The sheep must have been on the property for at least 2 years.

Abattoir 150: At least 150 sheep, over 2 years of age, have been submitted to an abattoir in the past 12 months, in 1 or more lots, have been examined and all found negative for OJD. The sheep must have been on the property for at least 2 years.

NOTE 5: Other: Post mortem examination by a SheepMAP vet with no indication of OJD, or other negative test.

NOTE 6: Infected Flocks: A flock which is infected with OJD, and there is evidence of or likely potential for transmission of infection within the flock, and the flock has not met the requirements for resolution of infection in accordance with the current National OJD Standard Definitions, Rules and Guidelines (SDR&Gs).

NOTE 7: NLIS 'T' tag (terminal) lamb: A lamb which is to be slaughtered before it cuts its first permanent teeth and is identified by an NUS (sheep) 'T' tag. The 'T' tag may be a requirement for trading into some areas.

NOTE 8: Approved Vaccinate: A sheep that is identified by an NUS (sheep) 'V' tag and is:

- vaccinated with an approved OJD vaccine by 16 weeks of age, or
- vaccinated with an approved OJD vaccine after 16 weeks of age, when the flock:
 - o was in the SheepMAP, or
 - o had undertaken a negative Faecal 350 test in the two (2) years preceding the vaccination, or
 - o had a Negative Abattoir 500 status at the time of vaccination.

NOTE 9: Other: This could include sheep sourced from historical Low Prevalence Areas (LPA), or sheep that previously had an ABC score higher than 4, or were from an area with a regional biosecurity plan.

NATIONAL CATTLE HEALTH DECLARATION EXPLANATORY NOTES

OVERVIEW

The Cattle Health Declaration Is a legal document. Please complete accurately before signing.

Cattle Health Declarations are a way for producers to provide information about the health status of the cattle they are selling. Buyers should ask vendors for a Declaration and use the information provided to determine the health risks associated with the animals offered for sale.

Some states require testing or certification additional to that outlined in this document. e.g. Johne's disease (JD) in WA. Please check the entry requirements for any interstate movements at: www.animalhealthaustralia.com.au/what-we-do/endemic-disease/livestock-movements/

The original is to be attached to the National Vendor Declaration (NVD) form accompanying the cattle, if applicable. A duplicate remains with the vendor; it is recommended the vendor retains a copy of this declaration for seven (7) years.

QUESTION 3: PESTIVIRUS TESTING

Persistently infected animals can be detected by conducting a pestivirus antigen test. This test only needs to be conducted once in an animal's life. Cattle that test positive in most cases are persistently infected animals. Pestivirus antibody testing may be done to check the pestivirus status of the herd. Contact your veterinarian for assistance in understanding the test results.

QUESTIONS 4 & 5 – ENZOOTIC BOVINE LEUCOSIS (EBL)

All cattle entering Tasmania must meet at least **ONE** of the following criteria:

- Cattle have been tested for EBL with the ELISA test within 42 days before shipment with negative results and evidence supplied via an attached laboratory report. If samples were pooled, no more than 10 sera or 30 milk samples were combined in each pool. Unweaned calves less than 12-weeks-of-age transported with their dam do not require testing for EBL; *OR*
- Dairy cattle from a registered dairy herd must be accredited as Monitored Negative (MN) or better, according to the national guidelines for EBL Control; *OR*
- Beef or beef-cross breeds must come from herds in Victoria, South Australia, Western Australia (*excluding the cattle tick infested area*), New South Wales (*excluding the former North Coast Livestock Health and Pest Authority District*), or Queensland (*excluding the cattle tick infested area*). The herd of origin must have been in existence for at least three (3) years with no evidence of EBL infection in the last three (3) years.

QUESTIONS 6, 7 & 8: JOHNE'S DISEASE BEEF CATTLE

Note: JD Is a notifiable disease, so it is important to answer these questions.

Occurrence of JD refers to clinical disease in the herd or on the property. Clinical disease is an infected animal with chronic diarrhoea and weight-loss that does not respond to treatment.

The **Johne's Beef Assurance Score (J-BAS)** is a tool developed for JD risk profiling. Details are available on the Animal Health Australia website under 'JD in cattle'. The J-BAS is an initial guide and purchasers should ask for more information about JD in the origin herd (see JD in Cattle Biosecurity Checklist on the AHA website under 'JD in cattle'). Transitional arrangements are in place until 3D June 2017. The *National Farm Biosecurity Reference Manual – Grazing Livestock Production* provides a template to use for the property biosecurity plan. All plans should include the JD in Cattle Biosecurity Plan Checklist.

Check test – testing of 50 adult animals in the herd (or all eligible animals in a herd if less than 50 adult animals) biased to increase the probability of detecting infection, tested by ELISA, (pooled) faecal culture or (pooled) HT-J faecal PCR.

Sample test – screening of the adult herd or a large representative sample of the adult herd by an approved test (ELISA, (pooled) faecal culture or (pooled) HT-J faecal PCR).

QUESTION 9: JOHNE'S DISEASE DAIRY CATTLE

JD herd status information about Dairy Assurance Score calculation is available at www.dairyaustralia.com.au/bjd

QUESTION 10 & 11: TREATMENTS & VACCINATIONS

Provide details on any cattle treatments and vaccinations within the last six (6) months.

Some manufacturers include more than one of the categories listed in the same vaccine, known as a combination vaccine. If you use a combination vaccine, each agent(s), as appropriate, should be detailed.

For vaccinations to be current, you must have followed the manufacturer's recommendation for vaccination. Typically, young animals or first time vaccinated animals need two (2) doses, followed by annual boosters. As variations to this general rule do occur (e.g. Silirum is given once only), you must use the manufacturer's recommendations.

At the date the declaration is made, the animals must be considered protected from the diseases listed.

DECLARATION

This section must only be completed by the owner or person responsible for the husbandry of the cattle in the consignment.

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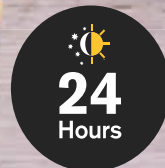
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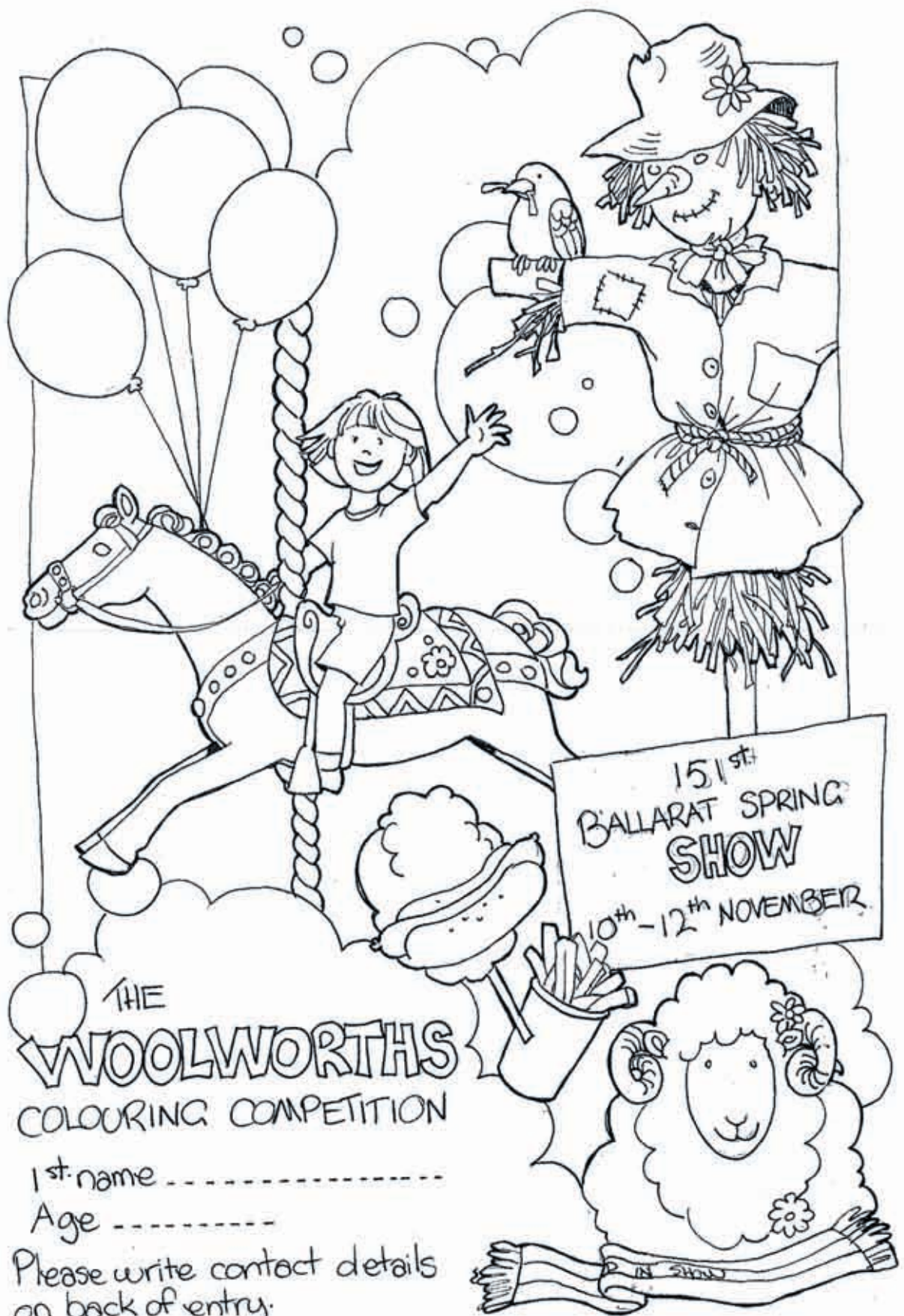

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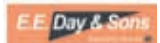
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
