- For legal reasons Kylie will not examine non- Hendra vaccinated horses that fall ill.

- Owners of these horses will need to seek vet service elsewhere.
- Dr Schooley will be happy to examine unvaccinated horses with traumatic injuries and all problems in horses vaccinated against Hendra in the last 12 months.
- **You may be asked to provide your Hendra vaccination certificate before examination.**

Conditions of Entry

1. Numbers for all **classes will be capped** - preference will be given to DD & SW regional members.
2. **IQ riders from other IQ regions** are welcome to nominate but must ride HC if accepted. This means they are not eligible for ribbons, trophies or team prizes. Scores however may still be used for qualifying for the State Championships.
3. In the case of oversubscription, riders NOT accepted to compete will be notified by e-mail within 7 days of close of entries and will have nomination money refunded in full. For refund of any stable & camping fees, the rider MUST e-mail the OC of any changes to stable and/or camping requirements within 7 days of being notified of not being accepted for a class or classes.
4. **Second horses** – please refer to relevant discipline notes. Only the higher point scoring horse will be eligible for teams & school points.
5. **Prizes:** Sashes, saddlecloths and trophies for Champions, Ribbons to 6th place. Teams: Ribbons to 4th place.
6. **Unmounted presentations** will be held at the conclusion of each day's event. It is compulsory for all Darling Downs & South West riders to attend presentations on the days they compete. Failure to comply with this rule will result in elimination from the entire competition and scores will not be eligible as qualifiers for the State Championships. Exemptions to this ruling are possible if sought in writing or e-mail prior to the event from the President Mr Ben Muirhead 0427 721698 or in the case of Emergency during the competition.
7. **Draw & Helper's roster: No Helper, No Ride Policy.** Roster will be available on the IQ website and on Nominate, One week prior to event. Every rider must have a nominated helper per discipline and all jobs must be done or a substitute person nominated. If it is found that there has been no helper after the rider has competed, the rider will not be eligible for placings and scores will not be eligible as qualifiers for the State Championships. Each helper is required to report to the office at least 10 minutes prior to their allotted starting time to sign in. School co-ordinators are not the preferred option to do a parent's job.
8. **Marshalling/Gear Check.** A designated Marshalling / gear check point will be made available and is compulsory for all competitors prior to their entry in each and every class. Competitors are to gear check at least 15 min prior to ride time. All equipment should comply with EA regulations for that particular discipline. This is the responsibility of the competitor and/or parents and not the volunteers at Marshalling/Gear Check Stations.

9. **Membership.** All schools represented must be current financial members of EQ. Riders must be financial members at close of entries.
10. All **dogs to be on a leash at all times** during the competition. If you must bring a dog, please keep it away from competitors & competition areas at all times.
11. **Scratchings-** Before the event, please e-mail all scratchings immediately to relevant discipline convenors as soon as possible to facilitate the smooth running of this event. **During the event, please text 0419 713592.** There will be no refund for scratching after close of entries unless accompanied by a veterinary/medical certificate. A 30% admin fee will apply on the total entry including Camp/Stable fees. Certificates are to be received by the OC within 7 days of commencement of competition.
12. Riders may **substitute** an alternative horse up until the start of competition for the day providing proof of IQ registration is presented to the organizing committee and the request is accompanied by a veterinary certificate.
13. **No rider may be substituted for another.**
14. In the event of **cancellation of the competition** or part thereof, due to any circumstances beyond the control of the relevant organizing committee, entry fees will be refunded less 30% to help defray administration costs.
15. **Stabling and camping.** Stables, where possible, will be pre-allocated in School groups and no barring of stables or changing of locations is permitted without approval of the stabling manager. Stables must be left clean. Schools will be held responsible for making sure their stables are left clean. Riders (or school representatives) must check in at the stabling office to obtain directions and to complete required paperwork. All horses that enter the ground MUST fill out the Horse Health Declaration & hand it to stabling manager. Horses are not permitted in stables before this process has been completed – please allow sufficient time before competing for this process. Horses not nominated for the competition will not be allowed entry to the grounds. There is to be no stabling or lodging of horses in areas outside the designated stabling complex i.e. no electric tape or portable yards
 - Stables are available at a cost of \$20 per stable for the duration of the event.
 - Powered camping facilities are available for \$20 for the duration of the event

16. **Competition schedule.** The competition times in the published schedule are correct at the time of publication and should be taken as a guide for competitors only. Rings may run early due to scratchings - please be attentive to announcements to this effect on the day. Riders may be invited to ride earlier, if convenient. If this is possible it would be greatly appreciated to help towards a timely finish. Riders who do not ride at their designated time without prior approval from the OC (e.g. let the office or gear check know if held up in another ring), may face elimination.
17. **Disputes** – as per the current IQ Handbook. No competitors or parents or coaches are to directly approach any judges, stewards, course builders or any other officials or volunteers with disputes or complaints. Queries may be directed to the Technical Delegate or organizing committee through the team captain or school co-ordinator.
18. **Soundness and safety.** The judges are required to satisfy themselves regarding soundness of all horses and therefore have authority to stop an unsound horse from competing at any time during the competition. The technical delegate in consultation with the judges may at any time stop and eliminate from the competition any rider that they deem to be unsafe or to have the potential to cause harm to themselves and others.
19. **Behaviour.** The EA Codes of Conduct must be observed by all competitors and their parents/guardians during this event. They can be found in the current IQ Handbook. Those who fail to do so risk elimination from the competition. Being a school based event, all competitors must obey school rules and competition etiquette when representing their school and whilst on competition grounds. Damage to any third party by anyone at the competition will be the responsibility of the adult involved or the parents or guardians of those who cause any damage.
20. **Vehicles other than cars and trucks.** IQ, EQ and the Darling Downs Interschool Equestrian Association accept no responsibility in relation to the use of motorized vehicles on the grounds over the course of the competition. Motor bikes, four wheelers, trikes, scooters, bicycles or other such vehicles will not be permitted on the grounds where horses are being worked or competed and it is the responsibility of parents and guardians to enforce this ruling. Users of such vehicles risk having them banned or expelled from the grounds if they are being used in a manner which is deemed dangerous or irresponsible by the organizing committee
21. **DPI/Biosecurity.** Competitors are responsible for checking with the DPI regarding the requirement for spraying of horses. A Horse Health declaration MUST be filled out for every horse on the ground – please leave with stable manager.
22. **Medication Control.** Random swabbing of horses may occur to ensure that all horses are competing under the national EA and FEI competition rules without being influenced by prohibited substances. Please ensure that you have all horses' registration papers available. More information can be found at: <http://www.qld.equestrian.org.au/content/medication-controlswabbing>
23. **Saddlery and equipment** – as per current IQ Handbook for each discipline
24. **General Dress for riders** – as per current IQ Handbook. Riders are expected to be present in their official school equestrian uniforms for the prize giving.
25. **Horses.** Stallions are not eligible to enter. Horse abuse in any form will not be tolerated. If horse abuse is determined the athlete will be disqualified from the competition. The sighting of blood on the horse during a competition phase can entail elimination and/or investigation by the Ground Jury/Technical Delegate based upon the Sport Rules of the discipline involved.
26. **Teams.** There are two divisions, Primary and Secondary. Teams are to consist of 3 or 4 riders with the top 3 scores counted; the fourth rider's score is used in the case of a tie. Teams are NOT pre-nominated and will be made up of the best 3 or 4 riders from each school on the day. Team members must all be from the same school. All classes will count toward team points. In the case of riders competing in more than one class per discipline, only one class per discipline will count towards teams & school points. This will be the class in which the rider achieves the highest IQ point score. For prizes/ribbons to be awarded there must be a minimum of three teams in a division. The organizing committee, at their discretion, reserves the right to award team ribbons and prizes where less than three teams are present in the primary division. A school may have more than one team in a division provided it has at least 7 riders.
27. **General disclaimer.** Neither the organizing committee, the Darling Downs Equestrian Association, IQ Equestrian Queensland, nor the Western Downs Regional Council (Dalby Show Grounds) accepts any liability for any accident, injury, illness to riders, spectators, horses, grounds or any other persons or property whatsoever in consideration of entries being accepted. No entries will be accepted unless riders and parents have noted the Acknowledgment and Indemnity Waiver.
28. **Photography consent.**
By participating in this event you are consenting to your child/children being photographed or filmed. Equestrian Queensland may use these images for promotional use of the Interschool program, this includes but is not limited to, use on the Equestrian Queensland website, marketing material and in all forms of media. I understand photos in which my child/children appear may be submitted to Equestrian Queensland, partners and stakeholders who may also use these images for the purpose of promoting their association with Equestrian Queensland.
29. **Champions & Tied Scores** for all disciplines will be as per the current IQ Handbook
30. **Best all-round rider.** The Summers Family Trophy will be awarded to the rider with the best all round result from the one horse/rider combination across all 5 disciplines. To be eligible for this award, riders must enter all five disciplines on the one horse (Dressage, CT, Showjumping, Show Horse and Showman) at official level. The winner will be the rider with the highest aggregate IQ points from all five disciplines.

Para-equestrian tests will be offered to competitors at this competition. Expressions of interest from competitors will be required before 9th April advising either Lisa Gall or Sam Duffy (EQ) which levels the competitor is eligible to ride. Those wishing to compete will then be informed by email what tests are being held, nominations must be received by the closing date.

No late nominations will be accepted

- A horse may not be competed below the horse's EA dressage grading at time of close of entries
- Each **horse and rider combination** may only enter **ONE class – except for classes with only 1 test**
- Riders may enter two horses, but only the higher scoring horse's points will be eligible for team placings
- Gloves are compulsory for all classes.
- Whips are to be no longer than 120cm for horses and 100cm for ponies (i.e. not exceeding 149cm with shoes, 14.2hh). This includes in exercise and warm-up areas. This length includes the tassel.
- Spurs : Ponies under 14.2hh may only have blunt ended spurs: max 4cm, measured from the riders boots
- Callers are **only permitted** for primary riders.
- Copies of the tests **will not** be available from the office on the day.

- **Only one horse and rider combination may be nominated for this competition.**
- **Only** Primary Riders are allowed a caller for the Dressage Phase.
- This event will be run as per The National Interschool Rules and no Parent/Coach can enter or give assistance to the rider once they have been gear checked and entered the competition arena.
- Extra equipment such as back protectors and boots for the jumping phase may be left at gear check before competitors commence their test
- Uniform requirements particular to Showman
- **Whips are permitted and must be no longer than 75cm.**
- **Gloves are compulsory**
- **S3 Showman Dressage Test is optional rising or sitting trot**

Note – Showman will be offered at IQ State Champs 2016 but NOT at Nationals 2016

These classes are qualifiers for the 2015 State Interschool Championships.

Classes

- SH1. Primary Hack
- SH2. Primary Hunter
- SH3. Primary Working Hunter
- SH4. Secondary Hack
- SH5. Secondary Hunter
- SH6. Secondary Working Hunter

Interschool Show Horse consists of classes for Show Horse, Show Hunter and Working Hunter. Each class has three (3) phases. All classes have an In-hand presentation, Rider phase (judging the rider) and Ridden phase (judging the horse). Working Hunter includes a Jumping phase.

The points earned across all phases determine the championship placing.

The same horse/athlete combination must complete all phases in the order specified in a timed draw as determined by the Organising Committee.

The Rules for Interschool Show Horse have been designed to correspond with the National Show Horse Rules wherever possible, however some variations have been necessary to meet Interschool competition requirements.

Judged under current EA

SHOW HORSE RULES.

- Riders must complete all phases in the class on the same horse.
- Rider and horse/pony combination may compete in one class only, and must choose between show horse, show hunter or working hunter.
- Riders may ride more than one horse on the day in the Show Horse, Show Hunter or Working Hunter class.
- Each class will have a timed draw and all riders will complete an individual workout for each phase.
- Safety of all Interschool athletes is paramount, thus the Organising Committee has the right to determine in which order the phases will be held.

- Ribbons will be awarded for led, rider and ridden classes and Championship (combined score across phases).
- The Championship (total points earned over all phases) will determine the overall ranking of riders
- Competitors may walk the jumping course for the Working Hunter Competition prior to the start of the first held phase of the class for the competition.

Dress, Saddlery and Equipment

Will largely be as per National Show Horse Rules with some exceptions specifically for Interschool Show Horse competitions:

- A number must be displayed at all times in each phase.
- **Short boots** with heels should be worn in the **rider phase unless the rider is over 18 years**, in other phases long boots, gaiters/ chapettes are permitted
- Either a dressage, show, jumping or all-purpose saddle is allowed.
- Martingales, bearing, side or running reins of any kind are not permitted
- Jumping Boots (including over-reach boots) are allowed for the jumping phase in Working Hunter only
- Safety vests/back protectors may be worn in the jumping phase of working hunter
- **Horse and ponies must be ridden in a snaffle bridle in all phases of working hunter**
- Spurs may be worn, but must be removed for the In-Hand phase

Show Horse and Show Hunter Special Rule:

- Riders must decide if their mount is either a Show Horse, Show Hunter or Working Hunter.
- They cannot compete the same mount in more than one class.
- Show Horse classes will be conducted under the National Show Horse Rules and Guidelines, which can be obtained from the website.

Number of Horses

- Riders may ride more than one horse on the day in the Show Horse, Show Hunter or Working Hunter class.

Workouts

- Set workouts for all classes will be advised prior to the Competition.

For 2015 Classes annotated with * are now a state qualifying classes, but not offered at National competitions

- Ribbons for all 3 phases, to 6th place, will be handed out after the class finishes.
- In all classes the height of the event is listed in cms.
- Course walk will commence at 7.30 am
- **Rules & gear/dress as per current IQ Handbook**
- Back protectors are not compulsory under EQ rules; however IQ strongly recommends their use in the interest of safety.
- **Important note – Riders may enter a maximum of 2 horses in the same or different classes. ATHLETES MUST ONLY RIDE ONE CLASS PER HORSE AT ALL SCHOOL QUALIFYING COMPETITIONS AND REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS.**
(NO EXEMPTIONS TO THIS RULE)

These entries will only be accepted if there is sufficient space on the day. The OC will NOT hold up classes for riders with multiple horses or classes – riders may have to choose which class is more important.

- Each rider will only have their best points performance count towards team placings if there are more than 1 classes or horses nominated

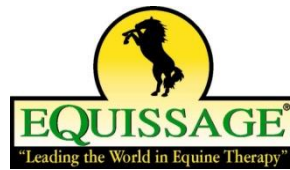
