VOLUNTEERING: Please note one volunteer per team will be allocated jobs to do during the event, (which will include pencilling and test sheet collecting).
IF your volunteer info is not recorded or payment offered your entry will be rejected.
If your volunteer does <u>NOT</u> turn up to their job your team will be <u>penalised 10 POINTS</u>.

Please read the General Rules and Conditions before you enter. It is your responsibility to know the discipline rules run under EA for each event entered.

## **General Rules and Conditions**

## Competing at this event will be recognised as evidence of participation to qualify for entry to 2020 EV State Championships.

This event is to be run under EA / FEI rules in so far as they are applicable to this event and shall include any other rules formulated by the organising committee. We strongly

recommend that all competitors obtain a copy of the relevant EA / FEI Rules though the EV website www.vic.equestrian.org.au

Please note: EA membership is required to compete at the State Championship.

#### Eligibility

Open to EA, PCAV, and HRCAV who are currently enrolled at a Primary, Secondary, or University or TAFE institution. Current membership cards must be presented at registration.

#### **Duty of Care and Risk Management Policy**

The Elmore Equestrian Park and Equestrian Victoria incorporated have a Duty of Care and Risk Policy which are available on the EA website.

#### Member and Child Protection Policy

EA Member Protection Policy, Child Protection Policy and other relevant Codes and Policies relating to the conducting of an equestrian event under EA rules are available on the EA website

#### Codes of Conduct for EA Conducted Equestrian Events

Codes of Conduct for competitors, spectators and volunteers as well as any other relevant Codes and Policies relating to the conducting of an equestrian event under EA rules are available at the EA website. At time of entry you will be required to confirm that you have read and agree to the Codes of Conduct. Riders and associated families will be reported to EA should any incidence of bullying or abuse towards volunteers arise, and riders will be at risk of elimination.

#### **Discipline Rules and Regulations**

By entering this event you give permission for professional photographers to photograph your child, then to sell those images on their website.

#### **Smoke-free Environment**

In accordance with the EA recommends that the following policies be applied to all sporting and social events that we hold or we endorse \* No Smoking shall occur at or near sporting events involving children and young people under the age of 18. This policy shall apply to coaches, athletes, officials and volunteers \* Social events shall be smoke-free, with smoking permitted at designated outdoor areas \* Coaches, officials, volunteers and athletes will refrain from smoking and remain smoke-free while they are involved in an official capacity in our sport.

#### **Alcohol policy**

As this is an elite sporting event for under age athletes, adults please be mindful of the example you are setting. Any rider under 18 years of age drinking alcohol will be eliminated from the event. It is also an offence to supply alcohol to under age persons and will result in your rider being eliminated. Parent or supporter alcohol consumption is to be kept to a minimum. Consumption of alcohol is not accepted by the organising committee after 9:30pm, consequences will occur.

#### Horse Welfare

The welfare of the horse is paramount. Instances of cruelty or mistreatment should be reported to the organising committee. Unsoundness: Judges are required to satisfy themselves regarding soundness of all horses and therefore have the authority to stop and unsound horse during competition. At other times a horse that is stopped or reported by an official who considers it to be unsound must attend a soundness check by the organising committee before continuing in the competition. Horse abuse will not tolerated and will result in elimination.

#### Number of Classes you may enter

Riders entering classes MUST bear in mind that the welfare of the rider, horse and the relevant EA rules for the discipline. Riders are only allowed to enter 2 consecutive dressage levels on the same horse i.e. Prelim/Novice or Novice/Elem.

One horse, one rider. One rider with a maximum of 2 mounts may ride 2 horses in the same team.

Show jumping competitors may only enter one height class per horse.

Show horse combinations may only compete in one section Show horse section; Show Horse, Show Hunter **OR** Working Hunter. Combined Training riders may only compete in one class per combination

#### Same School Teams

Teams must represent the school they are attending. Teams will consist of a maximum of four riders.

#### **Composite Teams**

If your school is unable to field a team, you will be placed randomly in a composite team by Nominate. Composite teams are made up of four riders from different schools.

#### Tertiary (either University or TAFE)

Riders must represent the tertiary institution that they are currently attending. Tertiary riders are **NOT** eligible for state qualifying events.

#### **Team Manager**

Each team requires an adult team manager, who is responsible for their riders and mounts during the competition, and completion of entries and co-ordination of your team helper.



#### Uniform

Team members are to wear the uniform of the school they currently attend. Uniform can consist of:

- School jumper, shirt, tie and light coloured jodhpurs.
- Polo shirt or Rugby shirt with school logos and light coloured jodhpurs.
- · Riding boots are to be smooth soled and low healed boots (short or long refer discipline rules)
- Gloves are compulsory for the dressage.
- · Gaiters and long boots may be worn in all disciplines except show horse, where top
- boots and gaiters can only be worn by competitors 18 years and over in rider phases.
- Mounts to have school coloured saddlecloths.
- Riders must provide their own bridle numbers, saddlecloth number or number holder.
- Riders must wear medical armbands when competing show jumping and novelties.

#### Helmets

Riders must wear an approved helmet with the chin strap fastened at all times. Protective headgear must conform with one of the current approved safety standards:

- Current Australian standard AS/NZS 3838 (2006 onwards) provided they are SAI Global marked.
- New Australian standard ARB HS 2012 provided they are SAI Global marked.

• Current American standards ASTM F1163 (2004a or 04a onwards) provided they are SEI marked, or standard SNELL E2001.

- Current British standard PAS 015 (1998 or 2011) provided they are BSI Kitemarked.
- Interim European Standard VG1 (01.040:2014-12) with or without BSI Kitemark.

#### **Gear Check**

There will be no gear check points. Gear checks are the responsibility of the team manager. Discipline rules can be found on the EV or EA website. Judges have the right to immediately eliminate a rider if they compete in incorrect gear. Random checks including helmets will be taking place.

#### Lunging

Lunging can only take place in the round yard. Only the competitor can ride and lunge his/her horse or pony on the grounds. The penalty of disobeying this rule is **elimination**.

#### Led Competitors

Combinations entering year Prep-Year 2 classes led, must NOT have competed at ANY event off the lead.

#### Age of Rider PRIMARY

Primary competition is restricted to students up to and including grade/year 6.

#### SECONDARY

Secondary competition is for those students who are in years 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12 and 18 years of age and under.

#### **SENIOR / INTERMEDIATE**

In dressage, Secondary Senior and Intermediate divisions are offered. Senior is for those athletes in years 10,11 and 12. Intermediate is for students in year 7, 8 and 9.

#### TERTIARY

The tertiary competition is open to students of any age who are currently undergoing tertiary study. You must be able to show that you are currently enrolled within a tertiary institute.



#### Scoring

 $1^{st} = 6$  points  $2^{nd} = 5$  points  $3^{rd} = 4$  points  $4^{th} = 3$  points

- $5^{th} = 2$  points
- $6^{th} = 1$  point

There is no penalty for rider numbers in each class

#### Prizes

Rosettes and Rugs will be awarded to the winning same school team, composite team, and Champion Tertiary Competitor.

Garland and Medallion awarded to Highpoint Primary and Secondary rider.

Place ribbons will be awarded in all other events to 6th place

#### **Dressage Rules**

• All dressage tests will be run in accordance current EA rules in the EA dressage competition rules, which can be obtained from www.equestrian.org.au/dressage-rules

- Whips are permitted (not exceeding 1.2 m, including tassels for horses and 1.0 m for ponies).
- Horses may not compete below their graded level (if an official dressage grading applies) however horses graded
- FEI are permitted to compete advanced
- Snaffle bits are allowed in all levels
- Double bridles are permitted in level Medium and above
- Spurs can be used at all levels and ponies. As per current EA ruling
- Dressage test can be downloaded at www.vic.equestrian.org.au
- Advanced, PSG and Inter 1 must obtain a score over 60% to gain points for your team. As per EA qualifying rule for PSG and Inter 1
- · Teams will gain points in each individual round
- Championship rounds will be granted champion and runner-up, but no team point allocation.
- Open to P.C.A.V and H.R.C.A.V and E.A members only
- · You may ride a level higher than dressage grade
- · Competitors are only permitted to ride 3 dressage tests per day which may include a combined training test

# **Combined Training**

#### **Combined Training Rules**

• The Combined Training will run in accordance with EA Rules in the Current EA National Eventing Rulebook, which can be obtained from the website, and contains dressage and jumping phases only.

· Riders are only permitted to complete in one class per horse

• The same horse and rider combination must complete both phases of the competition. Elimination from one phase involves elimination from the competition.

· Competitors are NOT permitted to ride with a whip or spurs within the dressage phase.

#### Scoring System

• As combined training runs under Eventing rules, rider are placed based on the number of penalties they incur over the 2 phases. This means that the rider with the least penalties when penalties from the dressage and jumping phases are added will be the winner. Dressage penalties are calculated by subtracting the average percentage from 100 and multiplying it by 1.5. The result is always rounded to one decimal point. Jumping penalties are calculated in the normal manner as per jumping.

• In the case of equal scored for placing's in a class, the rider with the best dressage score (least penalties) will be the higher placed. If equality still exists, the closest to the optimum time (under the time set) in the jumping element will be the higher placed. If there is still a tie, the placing will be shared and the subsequent place not awarded.



Show jumping rounds are scored individually One Round Table A Article 238 2.1

Athletes with equality of penalties for any place are places in accordance with the time taken to complete the round. In the event of equality of penalties and time for first place, there may be a jump-off over a shortene course over obstacles, which may be increased in height/or spread in accordance with the provisions of the schedule. Please note-this is only if fault and times are exactly the same so it is very rare that this second round jump off is ever run. **Two Phase** Article 274 5.3

This competition comprises two identical phases run without interruption, each at an identical or different speed, the finishing line for the first phase being identical with the starting line for the second phase.

The first phase is a course of 7 to 9 obstacles with or without combinations (Table A against the clock). The second phase takes place over 4 to 6 obstacles, which may include one combination (Table A against the clock).

Athletes penalised in the first phase are halted by ringing the bell after they have jumped the last obstacle or when the time allowed for the first phase has been exceeded, after crossing the finishing line of the first phase. They must stop after crossing the first finish line. Placing is according to the penalties and time in the second phase and, if

necessary, the penalties and time in the first phase. Athletes stopped after the first phase may only be placed after athletes who have taken part in both phases. In the event of equality for first place, the ties athletes will be placed equal first



Riders will enter the showing phase at the designated gate and will move to the next phase immediately after completing the previous phase. Rider can have ONE handler to aid them between the rider and in hand phase to unsaddle their horse. There is **NO** numnahs allowed.

There is to be absolutely no gear change once the rider has entered the gate for phase 1. Other than helping the rider unsaddle there is to be absolutely no interaction between rider and handler/instructor once the rider has entered the competition. This risks elimination.

#### **Novelties Rules**

• This discipline is designed to test the horse and riders agility.

- It is judged on time.
- Time penalties will be added at the discretion of the judge where novelty components are not performed accurately.

• This is designed to be a combination of novelties activities in one event, it may include Bending, Flag & Barrel, Key-hole, Mug Race and some poles.

• The reins must be OVER and not under the horse's neck in stepping stones. If the reins are knotted, they must be undone at the buckle end.

• No martingales, whips, or spurs may be used; use of baton, reins or other articles as a whip shall incur elimination of the rider from the event.

• Bits must be a plain snaffle with straight bar or a single joint in the middle. The mouth piece must be smooth all round.

• Bitless bridles (including the hackamore) are NOT permitted.

## Handy Mount Sponsored by:



#### **Handymount Rules**

•This discipline is designed to test a rider's horsemanship skills and the willingness of the horse or pony, with the focus on how the rider completes the tasks. The judge will be looking for rhythm, calmness and straightness, similar to a dressage test with obstacles.

•The class is not judge on time, but there is a time limit of 3 minutes, with no bonus points for finishing under this time. A bell will signal the end of the allowed time, after which the rider must leave the arena and will not score any more points. If you have a problem with a task, it is recommended to move onto the next task.

•You may choose your own pace unless a pace is specified for a particular task.

•Places will be determined by total points awarded for tasks completed within the allowed time. If equal places occur, the scores given for rider attitude and horse/pony manners will be considered.

•No martingales, whips or spurs may be used. Use of reins or other articles as a whip shall result in elimination of the rider from the class.

•Bits must be plain snaffle with straight bar or a single joint in the middle. The mouthpiece must be smooth all round. Bitless bridles, including the hackamore, are NOT permitted.
