Conditions of Entry and Eligibility Criteria for Championships

- The organising committee reserves the right to alter the program if circumstances dictate.
- Current EA rules apply with the onus being on the rider to understand these rules before competing.
- Gear check sites will be available near relevant arenas. Competitors must report for gear check prior to riding in each test, or will be eliminated.
- Please bring one completed Horse Health Declaration form and submit to Secretaries office before
- competing, where a wrist band will be issued to be worn for the full competition.
- In case of cancellation, the organising committee may retain an administration fee of up to 50%.
- No refunds after closing date unless accompanied by a certificate/notification from a recognised equine practitioner or recognised medical practitioner within 24 hours of the completion of the event to the Event Secretary. Organisers may retain up to 50% of the entry fees.
- **Stallions** must be handled and ridden by persons 18 years and older, unless special permission is granted from EA and must wear EA stallion green discs at all times as per current EA rules.
- Ponies will compete in the main draw for placing's and prize money but a separate Pony Championship will be awarded for highest aggregate percentage from their scores in the same Championship category (except for freestyles). (Need to tick relevant box on entry form).
- Juniors (17 years & under, full MARC Junior members) will compete in the main draw for placing's and prize money but a
 separate Junior Championship will be awarded for highest aggregate percentage from their scores in the same
 Club/Participant Championship category (except for freestyles). (Need to tick relevant box on entry form.)
- For OTT awards, competitors must (tick the relevant box) on the entry form to be eligible.
- Each horse may only compete in a maximum of 3 tests at 2 consecutive levels (each day).
- Each rider may only enter a maximum of 3 horses.
- Callers are permitted, but are only allowed at E & B or between the 2 arenas not impeding Judges' view.
- All spectators, including photographers and video operators, are not allowed within 10 metres of the arenas. This is an Equestrian Australia rule.
- Times for arena familiarisation will be placed on the draw.
- Riders MUST be prepared to ride at allocated draw time. Failure to be ready may result in elimination.
- Maryborough Park Conditions state that <u>NO DOGS</u> are allowed in equestrian precinct.
- Competitors who enter into the Dressage QLD Foundation AAOR Series competitions MUST fulfil the criteria set down
 in the Dressage QLD Foundation AAOR Series Qualifying Criteria, as published on the Equestrian QLD Website. The
 OC reserves the right to accept or reject an entry based on eligibility criteria. Competitors who wish their scores from this event
 to be considered for DQ Foundation AAOR Series end of the year awards must indicate they meet the criteria at the time of
 entry. No late requests to be considered for the DQ Foundation Series will be taken after the close of entries.

To be eligible for the following Championships, horses must have completed 2 classes specified for that category i.e.

Participant/Club Preparatory Champion (Classes 7 & 8)

Participant/Club Preliminary Champion (Classes 20 and 21)

Participant/Club Novice Champion (Classes 9 and 10)

Club Elementary Champion (Classes 22 and 23)

Competitive Preliminary Champion (Classes 1 and 2)

Competitive Novice Champion (Classes 16 and 17)

Competitive Elementary Champion (Classes 3 and 4)

The above Championships will be decided as per rule book i.e. 1st 35 points, 2nd 34 points etc with the Champion being the horse with the highest points; and in event of a tie, the highest aggregate percentage (and in event of a further tie, the higher percentage in the higher competition).

Pony Champion

Para Equestrian Champion

The above Championships will be decided from the highest aggregate % from two same level Competitive, or Participant/ Club tests (excluding freestyles). If equal, the highest % in the highest test will be awarded the Championship.

MARC Junior Champion

The above Championship will be decided from the highest aggregate % from two same level Participant/ Club tests (excluding freestyles). If equal, the highest score in the highest test will be awarded the Championship.

Information Relating to Young Horse/Pony Competitions: (Rules as per rule book page 48)

Height: Horses must have a height at the withers exceeding 149cms including shoes or 148cms without shoes: Ponies must not exceed 149cms with shoes or 148cms without shoes.

- The Riders and Horses must be EA registered and have current competition card.
- Age for all horses will be as at 1 August, birth date must be indicated on entry form

- Tests to be ridden are specified for each class on event program (Tick relevant Box on entry form)
- 4 YO Championship for Horses—open to Horses born between 1-8-2016 and 31-7-2017
- 5YO Championship for Horses—open to Horses born between 1-8-2015 and 31-7-2016
- 6YO Championship for Horses/Ponies—open to Horses born between 1-8-2014 and 31-7-2015
- 7 YO Championship for Horses—open to Horses born between 1-8-2013 and 31-7-2014
