CONDITIONS OF ENTRY AND GENERAL INFORMATION

This event is being conducted under the rules as per the IQ Handbook 2020 and EA and FEI Rules where applicable. It is your responsibility to read your Handbook and be aware of these rules. Riders/Horses must be registered with the Inter-school Queensland Sport Committee. The



organizing committee reserves the right to accept and/or reject entries. Competitors are reminded that Medication Control (swabbing) can occur at any event run under Equestrian Australia rules and regulations.

1. Entries will be capped

Due to the cancellation of our Darling Downs and South West Regional Championships due to COVID 19, preference will be given to riders from within this region.

2. COVID 19 Safe Plan

This event is being run in compliance with the Outdoor Sport Industry COVID Safe Plan. Safety protocols are in place in accordance with Queensland Government direction based on the latest available information: https://www.qld.equestrian.org.au/sites/default/files/industry-covid-safe-outdoor-sports%20v4%20as%20at%202%20July%202020.pdf

A full list of protocols and restrictions will be available several days prior to the event. All attendees must follow these specific instructions and adhere to hygiene and social distancing requirements. Please do not attend under any circumstances if you are unwell.

3. Nominate App

On arrival and departure of grounds all personal must sign in and out via the Nominate App. To download the App refer to the below links:

4. Awards

- Champions Rug and Sash
- Reserve Champions Hay Bag and Sash, 3rd: Prize and Sash, 4th Sash
- Ribbons to 6th place in each class
- Teams Trophy to the winning team in each discipline

Unmounted presentation will be held at the conclusion of each event. Social distancing must be adhered to at all time during presentation of awards.

5. Horse Health Declaration must be submitted before competing

Horse Health Declarations are to be completed on Nominate when entering and activated upon entering the grounds. Riders will not be able to go through gear check without submitting a completed horse health declaration.



6. Teams

A team consists of a minimum of three (3) and a maximum of four (4) individual riders from the one school. A rider may only be a member of one team per discipline. Riders with more than one horse will have the horse with the highest point score counted towards team results. Schools may have multiple teams however the first 4 ranked competitors make up the first team and the next 3 or 4 additional riders then count towards the second team and so on. A school cannot have 2 or more teams of only 3 riders.

7. Disclaimer of Liability

Neither the Organizers of any event to which these rules apply "SCOTS PGC College", nor Equestrian Australia, nor Equestrian Queensland, nor Warwick Horse Trials accepts any liability for accident, damage, injury, or illness to horse, athlete, ground, spectators or any other person or property whatsoever.

8. Reservation of Rights

"The Organizer reserves the right:

- To cancel any class or event
- To divide any class
- To transfer competitors between sections of the class
- To alter the advertised times
- To refuse any entry, with or without stating the reason."

9. This Event is run in accordance with the EA Code of Conduct

Being a school based event, all competitors must obey school rules and competition etiquette when representing their school and throughout the duration of this competition. Failure to do so may result in elimination.

10. Class numbers will be limited

Competitors on the wait list that do not compete will receive a 100% refund less the \$20 administration fee.

11. Substitutions

On approval form the organizing committee, riders may substitute an alternative horse up until the start of the competition on that day, providing proof of IQ registration is presented. Substitution of the rider is not permitted.

12. Competition Schedule

All published times should be taken as a guide for competitors only.



All competitors must present themselves at least 15 minutes before their start time at the Gear Check Steward. Competitors must be aware throughout the day of any announcements with regards change of times.

13. Scratchings

Will be accepted prior to the closing of entries via Nominate (the Riders Levy will not be refunded). No refund for scratching after close of entries unless accompanied by veterinary/medical certificate which must be supplied within 7 days after the last day of competition. 30% of fees (in addition to the Riders Levy) will be retained to help cover expenses. Scratchings and supporting evidence occurring after the closing date must be emailed to: equestrain@scotspgc.com.au

14. Cancellation of event

In the event of cancellation of the competition or part thereof, due to any circumstances, 70% of fees will be refunded. The balance of 30% may at the discretion of the organizing committee be retained to cover expenses.

15. Canteen

Canteen will be provided from Saturday morning and throughout the weekend for breakfast and lunch (take-away only).

16. DPI

Competitors are responsible for checking with the DPI regarding the requirement for spraying of horses.

17. Disputes

- No competitors or parents or coaches are to directly approach any judges, stewards, course builders or any other officials or volunteers with disputes, complaints or queries.
- Any disputes, complaints or queries during the competition must be lodged in writing with the Organising Committee through the School Convenor with a fee of \$150 within 30 minutes after the happening which gave rise to the objection.
- These will be referred to the Technical Delegate/Ground Jury of the day.

18. Ground Jury

This will be made up of the judges of each discipline.

19. Appeal committee

This will be made up of the President, Secretary, Treasurer and discipline convenors. The decision of the appeal committee is final.





20. Horse Health

Any horse showing signs of ill health either on arrival or during the event must be reported to Tracy Hilton (Stabling Manager – 0417 456 253) and will be isolated until seen by a veterinarian. Any expense incurred in this will be the responsibility of the owner.

21. Vehicles

Interschool Queensland nor Equestrian Queensland nor Equestrian Australia nor SCOTS PGC COLLEGE nor SCOTS Equestrian Riders Support Group nor Warwick Horse Trials accept no responsibility in relation to vehicles on the grounds over the course of the competition. Motorbikes, four wheelers, trikes or other such vehicles will not be permitted on the grounds. The use of bicycles is permitted, however they must be used in a responsible manner around the grounds and riders must wear appropriate headgear whilst riding on the grounds.

22. Helpers Roster

A roster will allocate jobs to each participating school on a pro rata basis. It is each school's responsibility to allocate jobs amongst the school's riders/helpers. Helpers are to sign on at the Administration Marquee 10 minutes prior to job time and remain at their allocated task for the rostered duration. Overall team results may be withheld if a school's job is not fulfilled.

23. Volunteers

SCOTS PGC College would like to acknowledge the help and time given by individuals on a voluntary basis. It would not be possible to run this event without the considerable help that these volunteers give. SCOTS PGC College is very grateful for their time and hard work which is given so freely.

24. Saddlery & Equipment

It is compulsory for all riders to report to gear check 15 minutes before their allotted start time. A number for each rider/horse combination will be allocated for the duration of the weekend. For a full list of approved saddlery and equipment please refer to the current Interschool Handbook and EA Rules.

25. Dress

Riders must compete in their registered school equestrian uniform and the rider's allocated number must be attached to both sides of the horse.

- Each phase will have a separate draw time and all riders will complete an individual workout in each one. Ribbons for in-hand, rider and ridden phases, and overalls will be presented at the end of the day.
- Rider/horse combination may compete in one class only, must choose between Show Horse, Show Hunter/Working Hunter.
- Maximum 2 horses per rider. Please be aware that classes will not be held up due to minimal time between horses.
- A competitor may not compete in the Mini and Primary Classes. Entrant must decide if they are a Mini or Primary.

- Back protectors are not compulsory under EQ rules, however IQ strongly recommends their use in the interest of safety
- Riders may enter a maximum of 2 horses in the same or different classes.
- The OC will not hold up classes for riders with multiple horses or classes riders may have to choose which class is more important.
- To be eligible for overall placings each rider/horse must jump both classes at this event. Individual competition starts can be used as qualifiers.
