Class Guidelines/Rules:

- 1. Waiver/Public Liability ALL RIDERS TO WEAR WRISTBAND SUPPLIED
- 2. Entry is voluntary, by paid online entry.
- 3. A rider not suitably attired may be precluded by the Ring Stewards from competing in an event.
- 4. Safety Helmets for Juniors & Hard hats or Safety Helmets for Adults must be worn at all times.
- 5. The committee accepts no responsibility, nor liability in respect to any damage to person, property or horse at this show. All competitors compete at their own risk.
- 8. The committee reserves the right to alter any or the entire program without due notice.
- 9. The committee reserves the right to refuse any entry without assigning any reason; no claim shall be made against the Committee.
- 10 If events clash, the competitor must decide which event to enter.
- 11. Protests must be delivered in writing to the Committee no later than 30 Minutes after the class in question. A \$20.00 fee must accompany the protest and will be forfeited if the protest is not upheld by the Ground Jury Committee.
- 12. Withdrawals received after the close of entries and up until 31st August, 2019 will be refunded 50% of class entry fees <u>only if accompanied</u> by a Medical / Veterinary certificate. No refunds will be considered after Sept 1st, 2019. Certificates can be emailed to thoroughbredspringfair@outlook.com
- 13. Newcomer: Horses competing in the Newcomer classes must not have competed under saddle at any show/competition (except racing) prior to 1st January 2019
- 14. Veteran: Horses competing in the Veteran classes must be 12 yrs and over as at 1st August 2019.
- 15. A Country Trained Thoroughbred: A country trained Thoroughbred is a thoroughbred that was trained by a country trainer, the horse's last stable return.
- 16. A Provincial Trained Thoroughbred: A Provincial trained Thoroughbred is a Thoroughbred that was trained by a Provincial trainer, last stable return.
- 17. A Metropolitan Trained Thoroughbred: A Metropolitan trained Thoroughbred is a Thoroughbred that was trained by a Metropolitan trainer, last stable return
- 19. An Overseas trained Thoroughbred is a Thoroughbred that was trained by an overseas trainer stable return/not raced /no stable return in Australia.

Example: New Zealand/Great Britain/Hong Kong/Ireland etc

- 18. A Horse shall be shown at the height shown on their current Measurement certificate; any horse not issued with a current Measurement Certificate may be required to be measured.
- 19. Stallions can only compete in specific stallion classes.
- 20. The Judge's decision is final
- 21. Show Hunters/Open Show Horses must decide between the Open Hack Classes
- 22. DPI Regulations are in force at this Show and will apply to everyone. PIC numbers must be supplied to gain entry into this Show and you are confirming that to the best of your knowledge your exhibit/s is/are in a healthy condition.

23. Rider Fall: In the event of a fall by horse or competitor, it will be the decision of the Judge or Ground Jury, or if there is no Ground Jury present, a representative of the organising committee, (informed if necessary by a doctor or medical officer in the case of a rider or a vet or horse welfare officer in the case of a horse), as to whether the rider or horse can continue to compete. Riders must be mounted on entering and leaving the arena on penalty of elimination. If during a workout, or on the circle there is a fall of horse and/or rider it will entail elimination from that class. If a horse leaves the workout area, other than at the direction of a judge or official, it will entail elimination from that class.

The Judge has the power to eliminate a horse or rider if it is deemed by the judge to be erratic and unruly.

24. Conflict of Interest:

A Competitor may not exhibit before a judge if within the period of six months prior to the date of competition:

- the Competitor is a member of the Judge's family
- the Competitor has represented the Judge or competed on a horse owned by the judge
- the horse or any horse was owned or leased by the Judge;
- any member of the Judge's family;
- the Judge's employer, employee or business partner.
- the Judge or his business partner provided privately arranged tuition to the horse or competitor (not including group clinics)
- the Competitor has given privately arranged tuition to the Judge or trained or prepared a horse owned or leased by the Judge, (not including group clinics)
- the Competitor is employed, has been employed by or has been a business partner of the Judge
- In addition to the above bullet points a competitor may not exhibit before a judge if he or his family has provided private accommodation for the Judge within a 3 month period prior to or during the event.
- 24. Dogs must be on a leash & controlled at all times.
- 25. Horse Welfare is paramount.
- 26. Areas will be set aside around the grounds for warmups & lunging these areas will be notified on a map displayed at the Horse Office work downs, warm ups or lunging will NOT be permitted inside the Main Arena at any time nor in or around the Dressage Arenas.
- 27. Negative behavior will not be tolerated, sportsmanship & courtesy is expected and the Show Committee reserves the right to ask patrons to leave the grounds if they deem this necessary.
- 28. Horses will be assigned a competitor number which must be display whilst competing. It is the owners/riders responsibility to supply & display the competitor number.

Judges will be rotated throughout the day.

Ribbons will be awarded to 5th place

Champion & Reserve Champion will also be awarded in most sections

General Information & Entry Guidelines for Thoroughbred Classes

All horses must be registered in a recognised Thoroughbred Studbook.

Entry is online via Nominate (only) and will close on Sunday 28th July, 2019

All horses will be assigned a competitor number and must display this number whilst competing.

<u>Fashions On The Field – Classes 111 – 114 - Judging Criteria:</u>

Clothing to show individual flair 'daytime race wear' and complement the horse.

The horse will be judged on its conditioning & presentation.

Note: Horses must only be exhibited by one handler. Handlers' shoes must be closed toe and suitable for running a horse out.

Horses can compete in either Ridden Open Show Horse classes or in Ridden Show Hunter classes - not both

Classes 201 – 235 & 301 - 303 are open only to Thoroughbreds previously registered to race, and defined as per Last Stable Return.

Classes 218 & 219 - 'Off The Track' series

Winners will eligible to compete at the Series Final These classes will be run under the official rules of the OTT series.

Classes 310 – 312 – First TB Owner and /or Beginner

Will only be required to walk & trot

Class 313 – Pleasure – Snaffle bridle, casual riding clothing, may be asked to work on a kind rein.

Classes 314 – 318 – Riders attire and saddlery to be worn relevant to the class

Horses will be judged on suitability and may be asked to show appropriate paces

- Classes 318 322- Racing Industry Riders mounted on any TB Studbook registered horse.
 - CL 318 Rider to be employed in the Racing Industry in a horse contact role
 - CL 319 Rider employed in any non-horse handling role within the wider Racing Industry
- Classes 323, 324, 325 Dressage Tests. Horses may only compete in 2 tests, consecutive. Callers are permitted for child riders and beginner riders. One horse, one rider.
- **Class 326 Working Hunter Novice.** Simple workout including 2 cross pole jumps 45cm Class 327 – Working Hunter – Open. Fig 8 workout including 5 cross pole jumps 45cm

Classes 328 & 329 – Trail / Utility

The pattern/workout will be available after close of entries and could include some or all of the following components – Gate, Work on a kind rein, Dismount & remount, Pick up & carry coat, Trot poles, Small jump, Back up, Forehand or Hindguarter turn.
