Entry Fees:

\$25 per FEI level test\$20 per EA level test, Preparatory to Advanced\$5 Administration Fee per Horse

Prizes:

Rosettes will be awarded to 8th place. Prize money will not be awarded.

Conditions of Entry & General Information

1. Membership and Horse Registration:

- Riders entered in classes 1,2 & 3 (e.g. Preparatory, Preliminary & Novice) must be current Participant or Competitive members of EA and it is recommended that Horses/Ponies be base registered. Horses/Ponies do not need to be EA life registered
- Riders entered in EA/FEI classes (Elementary and above) must be current Competitive members of EA and Horses/Ponies must be EA life registered
- Entry checks for membership and eligibility will be conducted by EQ

2. Student Status

- Riders competing at this event are to be currently enrolled as a student at the undergraduate, graduate or PhD level at a recognised tertiary institution within Australia at the time and date listed for close of entries.
- Riders must be able to provide proof of enrolment in the form of a valid student card or an 'Enrolment Status Report' produced by the university which they attend.
- Riders with a study status described as 'deferred' or 'interrupted' are not eligible to compete at this event.
- Entry checks for student status and eligibility will be conducted by EQ

3. Arena requirements

- Tests must be conducted in an approximately 60m x 20m arena, either in a specifically constructed arena or a grass paddock
- Arena boundary must be clearly demarcated by a fence, poles, cones or other obvious safely constructed boundary
- Arena letters must be clearly marked and in the correct position around the arena

4. Video requirements

- Videos must be taken from C
- Videos must be clear with minimal shaking
- Videos must be taken in one continuous viewing movements cannot be cut and pasted together
- Videos are not to be edited to include effects or enhancing
- Appropriate zooming is highly encouraged to assist the judges. Riders may lose marks if the judge is unable to accurately view the movement
- Submitted videos must have been taken after <u>1st January 2022</u>
- Participants are to email their video to <u>nextgen@equestrianqld.com.au</u>
- Participants may upload their video to YouTube or similar and include the link in the email. Entrants will have 7 days to upload their videos.
- Only one video per combination per class can be uploaded
- Videos will be deleted if submitted after the video submission closing time
- 5. Callers: Callers are permitted for all EA levels. Callers are not permitted for FEI levels

6. Horse grading eligibility for levels:

- Official grading will be taken at the date of the close of entries. Horses must meet EA grading requirements as per rule 4.8.3.2 for grading eligibility.
- 7. **Combinations** may submit entries in **two (2) consecutive** levels per event; for example. Preparatory/Preliminary; Preliminary/Novice; Medium/Advanced; Prix St George/Intermediate I.
- 8. Saddlery and Equipment EA rules apply to permissible saddles, bridles and bits. Horses may wear boots or bandages. Saddlecloths may be any colour.
- 9. **Protective Headgear:** For all riders approved safety helmets must be worn at all times when training, warming up or competing at this event. Please refer to rule 5.2 for the list of standards that headgear must comply with.
- 10. **Dress:** Formal attire is not required. Riders may wear any colour breeches and shirt, so long as they are tidy and tucked in. Shirts must be sun-safe and at a minimum cover the riders shoulders. Footwear must comply with rule 5.3 points a to b. Boots can be coloured or have decorative features.

- 11. Horse Identification Numbers do not need to be worn.
- 12. Entries: can only be made online at <u>www.nominate.com.au</u>. Incomplete information may result in the entry not being accepted.
- 13. Results will be released via email
- 14. Return of test sheets will be via email on completion of judging
- 15. Scratchings, Withdrawals and Refunds: Entry fees will not be refunded after the closing date of entries unless a medical or veterinary certificate is produced within 24 hours of the closing date of the event. In such cases, 25% of the entry fees will be retained by the OC. Entry fees will be refunded in full for scratchings before the closing date of entries. The administration fee will not be refunded.
- 16. Indemnity: Riders and/or owners whose entries have been accepted, undertake to indemnify the Committee against all claims, losses, suits and damages made against or suffered by the Committee by reason of any negligent act or omission on the part of any riders, trainers or attendants whilst they are attending, riding or otherwise handling a horse and agree that any act or omission on the part of such riders or attendants found in any action against the Committee to be negligent, shall be deemed to have been negligent for the purpose of any claim under this indemnity. Riders are required to acknowledge the Declaration form included on Nominate.com.au. Failure to agree to this condition will result in non-acceptance of the nomination.
- 17. **Code of conduct:** It is a condition of participation at this event that each person submitting an entry and their associates are bound by the rules, policies and by-laws of Equestrian Australia. This includes comments made on social media. Any complaints or conflicts should be managed with respect through official channels. As per EA Disciplinary By-Laws 3(j) any other person or organisation (for example, a parent/guardian, spectator or sponsor) who or which agrees, in writing or otherwise (whether on a ticket, entry form, conditions of entry displayed at a venue etc) to be bound by these By-Laws. Any rider, parent, official or associate to be found in breach of these By-Laws will be render the rider's entry forfeit with no refund of entry fees.
- Protests and Appeals: Objections must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit fee of \$150.00 (refer EA Gen. Regs) Art. 163/164/165). Attention is drawn to Rule 1.5 of EA Dressage Rules. Protests must be lodged with Dressage Queensland within 24 hours of results being posted.
