Led, Show Horse & Rider Competition Rules



Classes are run in accordance with Show Horse Council Australasia rules. For full completion rules please refer to www.showhorsecouncilaust.com.au

ENTRIES & PAYMENTS: All entries are via www.nominate.com.au

Entrants not members of NTSHA must pay day membership of \$25.00. Rings 1 and 2 - class cost is \$8 per class for NTSHA members & \$10 for non- members. Ring 3 – cost is \$25 for entry to all classes (non-members must still pay day membership).

INSURANCE LEVY: Equestrian Disclaimer is to be completed by all competitors and forwarded with entries.

REFUNDS: Refunds are subject to the production of a Vet or Doctors certificate stating that the horse/rider was suffering a condition that would prevent them from competing. Incorrect entries WILL NOT be refunded and a \$20 administration fee will be charged.

COMPETITORS: All competitors compete at their own risk. Ring 3 Competitors can not compete in Rings 1 & 2.

PROTEST: Any protest accompanied by a non-refundable fee of \$100 must be in writing, and handed to officials, within 15 minutes of the incident. Ruling on the protest by the NT Show Horse Association Committee members present at the show will be final.

FEED & WATERING: Whilst horses are on the Reserve the feeding and watering of them is the responsibility of the owner/exhibitor.

HEALTH: All horses must be free from contagious disease. Veterinary inspections may be carried out at any time and horses which, in the opinion of the Veterinarian, show signs of contagious disease, shall, if the organisers so order, be removed from the Reserve by the exhibitor at his/her expense.

DRUG TESTING AND TREATMENT RULES: It is the intention of the Drug Testing and Treatment Rules (Show Horse Council Australasia) all horses perform, at the time of competition, without any prohibited or banned substance/s within their system. A treatment sheet is required to be lodged to the NT Show Horse Assoc for any horse that has been administered any treatment, foreign substance, medication, drug, prohibited substance or banned substance, within 30 days of competition. Swabbing maybe conducted on a random or for cause basis.

ETIQUETTE: Competitors always will display correct manners to judges and officials. Failure to do so will result in exclusion from the remainder of the Show and further action may be taken at the discretion of the organisers.

EQUIPMENT: Saddlery must be in a safe condition to the satisfaction of the organisers, or the competitor will not be allowed to compete.

HUNTER / HACK CLASSES: Horses may only compete as either a Hack or Show Hunter **NOT BOTH and can only complete in said section for the 2022 season.**

ILL TREATMENT OF HORSES: Ill treatment of horses will not be tolerated and will result in automatic disqualification from further competition.

TIMES: Order of events shown in the program is a guide only. It is the responsibility of competitors to ensure they are ready for any event in which they are entering. The organisers reserve the right to vary the order and times of events as they see fit.

CHAMPIONSHIPS: The second-place getters in all classes that qualify for Champion must stand-by, and the horse/rider that placed second to the horse/rider sashed. Champion will be required for the judging of the Reserve Champion.

MEASURING: A current measuring certificate will be needed for horses competing in height classes. NTSHA committee representatives reserve the right to allocate a height for the purpose of the show. Ring 3 is Unofficial & no measuring certificate is required.

ATTIRE: To be in accordance with SHC rules. Suitable attire must be worn by all riders (jackets and plaiting is preferred in Hacking rings). Any handler or rider, who, in the opinion of the organisers, is not properly attired, will not be allowed to compete. Ring 3 is Unofficial – No plaiting, neat & tidy attire.

AGE OF COMPETITORS: for classes determined by age, age is at the day of competition.

APPROVED HEADGEAR: Riders/handlers Under 17 years of age must wear approved headgear to the current Australian (AS/NZ 3838; 1998 or European (EN 1384), or US (ASTNF 1163) standard. Riders 17 years of age and over are also permitted to wear bowlers and top hats.

LED CLASSES Horses entered in breed classes MUST have been registered. However, registration does not need to be current or financial. Only horses that are not eligible for a specific breed class are eligible for the "Any Other Breed" class.

OFF THE TRACK THOROUGHBRED SERIES Horses must be Stud Book registered, and registered with TRNT off the track and raced to be eligible to compete. Points will be accumulated over the show season.

JUNIOR RIDERS: Riders/handlers Under 17 years of age are not permitted to wear long boots in rider classes and Smartest on Parade. This includes gaiters and chapettes. Junior Handlers must wear approved headgear in led classes.

PRELIMINARY HACK, HUNTER, RIDER CLASSES: is one that has not been placed 1st, Champion or Reserve in an Open ridden Hack class/event at any Royal Show or has never been the Winner or Runner Up at the Grand National, any State HOTY Title or has never been the Winner of any HOTY Intermediate or Preliminary Title.

SHC CLASSES: Riders must be full financial members of NTSHA and horses must be registered with Show Horse Council of Australasia



COVID-19 GUIDELINES AND RESTRICTIONS

MINIMISING THE SPREAD OF INFECTION

- Everyone has a role to play to help stop the spread of infection, we must not be complacent.
- Physical distancing measures of 1.5 meters between people whenever possible must be followed (unless you live in the same household).
- QR Code Contact tracing will be in place for the purpose of any positive results being returned by competitors for NT Health to trace potential contacts. The information recorded includes the date and time of the activity, the name of each person in attendance, along with their phone number and email address. It is mandatory for everyone on the grounds to scan the QR code for Show Horse Council of NT at the event.
- There will be hand sanitiser readily available for all people in attendance to use.

PEOPLE SHOULD NOT PARTICIPATE OR ATTEND IF THEY:

- Have any cold or flu like symptoms, even if mild
- Have travelled overseas or interstate or been in close contact with a person with COVID-19 in the last 14 days.
- You are at a greater risk of more serious illness if infected with COVID-19, if you are:
 - Over 70 years of age
 - Over 65 years with chronic medical conditions
 - Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander over the age of 50 years
 - Have compromised immune system (i.e. cancer or chronic illness)

ONLY ESSENTIAL PEOPLE SHOULD ATTEND THIS SHOW, IN LINE WITH THE NATIONAL PRINCIPLES FOR THE RESUMPTION OF SPORT AND RECREATION, THIS INCLUDES:

- Competitors
- Strappers / support people
- Essential volunteers (i.e. Convenors, committee members, grounds volunteers, judges, stewards, etc)

PRACTICE SOCIAL DISTANCING AT COMMUNITY SPORT:

- No return of ribbons will be allowed at this event
- No exchange of cash will be allowed at this event (show entry)
- When watching sport, you will keep a distance of 1.5 metres between yourself and people who don't live in your household.

HYGIENE AND BEHAVIOUR: The risk of transmission of COVID-19 in sporting settings can be minimised by:

- All people practicing good hand hygiene at the start and end of competition and during the activity. When possible use soap and water to wash your hands (drying with paper towel) and/or using alcohol-based hand sanitiser when this is not possible.
- All people are encouraged to practice regular hand washing/sanitising.
- Cover your mouth and nose with a tissue or your sleeve (when you cough or sneeze)
- Wash your hands after sneezing or coughing or use hand sanitiser if this is not available.
- Try to avoid touching your eyes, nose, or mouth
- Do not congregate in bathrooms or any other area, always practice the 1.5 metre distancing between you and other
