GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- All Rider must be Current EA Members. All Horses in EvA95 and above must have current EA Registration, Free Base registration is available for all other horses on the EQ website
- Riders are responsible for knowing the rules. This event is conducted under the EA National Eventing Rules. All Dressage Tests and rules can be found on the EA Website. [Rules & Tests | Eventing Queensland \(equestrian.org.au\)](#)
- The Cross-Country course must be walked on foot only; unless permission is given to individuals by the TD and OC.
- Current level Body Protectors and helmets must be worn. [Changes to PPE \(Personal Protective Equipment\) Rules in Eventing | Equestrian Australia](#)
- Canteen will be open for Breakfast and Lunch, options for dinner are a 5-minute drive in Burpengary
- EA 507.6 Disclaimer of Liability: Neither the organising committee of any event to which these rules apply, nor Equestrian Australia, nor Eventing Queensland accepts any liability for any accident, damage, injury, illness to horses, riders, ground, spectators or any other persons or property whatsoever.
- EA 507.7 Reservation of Right: The Organising committee reserves the right – To cancel any class or event – To divide any class – To transfer competitors between sections of a class – To combine or divide Open and Junior classes – To alter advertised times – To refuse any entry with or without stating a reason.
- EA 515.2.7 CCN Objections – Only the owner, or their authorised agent, or the rider of a horse taking part in the competition is entitled to lodge an objection. The objection must be in writing and signed, presented to the Event Secretary or TD with a \$50 deposit. Please see rule for more clarification
- EA 536.2.1.1 The cross country must be walked on foot only unless permission is given by the TD who will take guidance from the OC. Any permission to be posted on the notice board, if not posted walking on foot only allowed

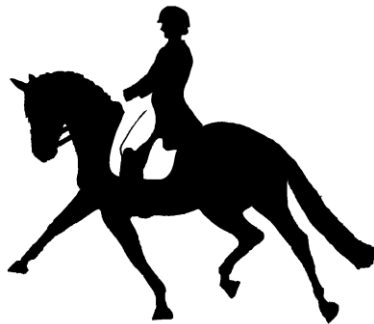
NOMINATIONS

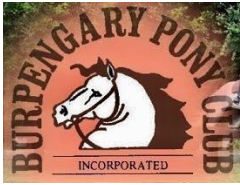
- All entries must be made through [nominate.com.au](#).
- It is the rider's responsibility to ensure they hold the necessary minimum eligibility requirements to enter their desired class. If you are unsure refer to Equestrian Australia National Eventing Rule 520.4. If you are a Junior, please indicate on your entry
- A Horse may be entered in any class for which it is eligible in accordance with EA Minimum Eligibility Requirements (MER). Ensure that you have entered the correct class, any changes will attract a fee, and this will be payable immediately. Substitution of horse or rider will be considered up to the 23rd May if it's in the same class, no other substitutions will be considered.
- Class - capped at 40 riders in classes. A waitlist will operate for oversubscribed classes.
- BEC reserves the right to reject any entry that is incomplete or incorrect information has been provided or incorrect fees paid.
- Prize Money – In all Official events, including those confined to Juniors, prizes will be awarded to horses according to their placings and the number of starters in the class. A minimum of one prize shall be awarded for every 4 competitors. A minimum of three prizes must be offered in every class. Third prize must not be less than the entry fee. EvA80, EvA95 and CCN* prize money is optional. Organisers may award additional prizes lower than the scale. Application to vary this rule must be made to the respective State eventing committee and approved by the state branch. A Nominee may collect Prize monies and ribbons if organised prior to leaving the event with the OC. Rugs winners will need to be present to collect.

- No Refunds after close of entries. Any refunds prior to the close will attract a 10% administration fee. If the event is cancelled there will be a 20% administration fee withheld.
- All yards and stables attract a Bond Levy. This will be refunded after the event via nominate and on inspection of yard/stable that has been used. A cleaning service is available for \$20 per yar/stable, contact stable manager, payable by cash on the day.
- Any non Hendra vaccinated horses staying overnight MUST stay in covered yard/stable due to the proximity of a bat colony. Microchip numbers must be supplied on nomination.
- Print out camping permit to show Stable Manager on arrival.

- The Burpengary Equestrian Centre prohibits any use of portable yards or electric tape. We would prefer no horses in the camping areas.
- NO DOGS are allowed on the grounds so please do not bring them otherwise you will be asked to leave.
- Medical Coverage at this event will be in accordance with the required level as specified in the Equestrian Australia National Eventing Rules. EA Annex D.1.CCN Medical and Veterinary Services.

ON THE DAY

- Competitors must hand in their Horse Health Declaration Form to the Event Secretary's Office upon arrival. Failure to do so will result in elimination from competition and may affect future attendance of the grounds.
- Competitors must report to the Gear Steward 10 minutes prior to your allocated dressage ride time. Riders are required to complete in the order stated on the draw.
- Riding is to be done in an orderly manner so as not to interfere with other competitors.
- Number Holders are to be provided by the rider, paper numbers are available at the office if needed.
- There is ample parking around the grounds but please be considerate of other competitors when positioning your float and vehicle near the yard area.
- Yards and Stabling are to be pre-booked on nominate.com.au under stabling.
- ***Please ensure that you leave the grounds clean & tidy. Any yards/stables used MUST have manure/feed etc removed prior to your leaving the grounds, otherwise you will not be refunded bond fee.***
- Bridle numbers can be worn in the dressage phase of competition on both sides of the saddle cloth or bridle.
- **Lunging IS ONLY permissible in the round yard near the stable complex**
- BIOSECURITY – All Horse owners & competitors should be aware that you have a biosecurity obligation to take all reasonable steps to ensure your activities do not spread a pest, disease or contaminant

Conditions of Entry – Burpengary Pony Club One Day Event 28-29th May 2022

- This Event is running in conjunction with the EA CCN* ODE – Camping and Stabling is limited will be done on a first in basis. All bookings via nominate. [Welcome to Nominate Stables](#)
- Some classes may show jump before cross country, this will be stated on the draw. The draw will be emailed and put on the Burpengary Pony Club FB page with any updates.
- Current Hendra vaccinated horses may stay overnight in a stable or yard. Any NON-current Hendra vaccinated horses staying overnight **MUST** stay in a stable or covered yard (due to the proximity of a bat colony)
- Completed Horse Health Declaration to be handed in to the office.
- Mobile Phones must not be used by riders when mounted on horseback.
- All Riders must wear current level Body Protectors and Medical Armbands on the cross country phase check that you have the current level BETA 2018 Level 3, BETA 2009 Level 3, EN13158:2009 Level 3, EN13158:2018 Level 3 (Jan 2021)
- Run under PCQ Rules open to PCQ Members only. Seniors scored by Horse Trials Rule 13 p21 Horse Trials Rule Book
- As a condition of entry, each club **MUST** provide a fence steward and dressage penciller for every three (3) entries or part thereof.
- The cross-country course is closed from midnight Sunday 15th May 2022.
- Competitors must compete in full pony club uniform
- Full club uniform must be worn to collect awards
- The Organising committee reserves the right to (a) cancel any class or event (b) to divide any class (c) to alter the advertised times (d) to refuse any entry with or without stating a reason (e) to transfer competitors between sections of a class (f) to combine classes if less than 3 competitors
- Disclaimer: Neither the organising committee of any contest to which these rules apply, nor the PCQ, accept any liability for any accident, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, ground, spectators or any other person or property whatsoever
- Objections must be made in writing to the secretary of the event accompanied by a deposit of \$50 – no later than half an hour of the issue of the marks or in the case of objections to the qualifications of competitors, not later than half an hour before the start of the event or in the case of objections to the show jumping course, not later than 10 minutes after the walking of the course and before the start of the competition or in the case of objections to the cross country course not later than four hours before the advertised starting time of the cross country. See Rule 38 page 30 of Horse Trials Rule Book.

- Refunds – Before close of entries you can withdraw or nominate or edit your entry. There will be no refund of entry fees for withdrawals after close of entries unless a written request with Vet or Doctor certificate included within 7 days and a 10% administration fee will be deducted. In the Event of COVID restrictions or an extreme weather event there will be a 10% administration fee held if the event is cancelled.
- Canteen will be open for Breakfast and Lunch. If camping, there are many Dinner options at Burpengary which is only a 5 min drive from the grounds.
- First Aid is in Attendance both days
- Official 12 yrs & Under riders may compete on any grade of horse provided it is their normal pony club mount
- Riders must enter the correct class and must have MER to ride from Preliminary up as per Horse Trials Rule Book 11(b) page 19. Riders cannot choose to upgrade on the day of the competition. This must be applied for and approved prior to the competition. Riders MUST compete in the class that is on their card. Those with an Introductory card, may also compete in Pre-Introductory. A horse is allowed to ride down one level from that stated on the performance card without penalty. If the horse competes at two or more levels down from what it has on its performance card, ten penalties will be added to its total.
- Seniors nominating in Preliminary or above, must be competing in this level at EA events. If horse/rider are riding up from Introductory for the first time, then copies of 3 MERs need to be supplied to the Club with the nomination. If rider/horse has no previous eventing history, Senior is to compete in Pre-Introductory or Introductory only (preferably Pre-Intro). Seniors, to be eligible for overall award, must participate in Official classes 13-U26year Class 3-6
- **Stable or Yard Bond** - This will be refunded via the entry process. You will only receive a refund if your stable has been cleaned of all manure, hay or any other material that is not sawdust. Please get stable manager or someone from the OC to inspect and lock when done.
- Riders in classes 1 – 6 must produce performance cards to the office prior to 8.00am on day of competition unless other arrangements have been made with the organising committee. If rider does not have performance card on the day of competition, ribbons and trophies are withheld until it is produced. Nominations that do not have Horse Registration number and riders who do not have performance card on the day, will compete HC



We take biosecurity seriously and have measures in place to mitigate the risk of infections, diseases, and pests.

OUR BIOSECURITY POLICY

All horse owners and competitors should be aware that you have a biosecurity obligation to take all reasonable steps to ensure your activities do not spread a pest, disease, or contaminant.

Competitors are asked to ensure good biosecurity practices at home and at the event and to follow the instructions of the organising committee and the Biosecurity Manager or risk expulsion from the event.

All horses entering grounds must be from a property actively practicing good biosecurity principles within their management.

Horse Health Declarations (HHD) are a mandatory requirement for all events. Please read the HHD form and ensure:

- Your horses are shampooed, rinsed, and allowed to dry, and their hooves are picked clean of all solid material and washed with shampoo
- Your vehicles and equipment accompanying the horses are cleaned to remove all solid material that could contain disease agents, and then disinfected

Acceptance into the event will be refused if the required HHD is not presented at point of entry or designated registration point, as advised by the organising committee.

The property identification code (PIC) of the horse's origin must be included on the HHD

Other biosecurity and workplace health and safety measures that aim to provide the safest environment for horses, competitors, volunteers, and visitors include:

- No horses with signs of illness are to be brought onto the grounds. No dogs on the grounds.
- No communal horse water troughs are available at this event.
- Do not share equipment, including food and water containers, between horses.
- Competitors are responsible for cleaning up manure from yards and placing it in designated areas. Please use your own rakes/shovels.
- Competitors are required to advise the event organisers immediately if a horse is sick. Stop all non-essential contact with the sick horse. Do not allow children to have close contact with the sick horse.
- Everyone handling horses should wash or sanitize hands between contacting different horses.

OUR BIOSECURITY PLAN

Our event biosecurity plan is a set of preventative control measures and actions aimed at reducing the risk of infectious diseases and pests on and off the venue, and between horses at the venue. This can be found at the event Office.

WHAT TO EXPECT IN THE UNLIKELY EVENT OF A BIOSECURITY INCIDENT

- In the unlikely event of a biosecurity incident, the Biosecurity Manager and the organizing committee will implement our event biosecurity plan.
- You will be notified about the incident and expected to follow the directions given by the organising committee.
- Everyone will be expected to remain at the venue until cleared to leave by the organising committee and Biosecurity Manager.
- In the event of horse movement restrictions participants are responsible for the care, maintenance and cost of their horses and themselves, including feeding, bedding, vets and personal needs.
- If a horse is confirmed to have an infectious disease the owner/ lessee will be responsible for all vet cost and if venue is locked down and quarantined will be responsible for all cost associated with this
