GENERAL CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

Conditions

Please read the General Rules and Conditions before you enter. It is also your responsibility to know the individual discipline rules.

All entrants must be a current financial Competitive Junior member of Equestrian NSW at the date and time of entry. Entries cannot be accepted without your current membership number.

Entries not complying with membership and registration criteria will be refused and will be refunded less a \$50 administration fee.

Support person

Due to the current Public Health Order SIEC is limited to a 500-person limit for community sport activities (including participants, officials and spectators) per day.

Riders will only be able to attend with one support person per day per horse. If you have 2 or more horses, you will be able to attend with the equivalent support people.

Entries

Entries will ONLY be accepted via Nominate and must be accompanied by relevant riding experience at the level you are entering: <u>https://nominate.com.au/</u>.

Riders will need to provide evidence to show the horse and rider combination are capable of the class/s entered. A result at previous competitions (EA affiliated club, show, pony club or Interschool) in the last 12 months and/or clinics and coaches the combination is currently attending, Incomplete qualifications may mean an entry is not accepted.

Combinations must compete at, or above, their dressage graded level. Eventing is subject to a current MER.

Primary students are in years K- 6 in 2020.

Secondary Intermediate are in Years 7, 8 and 9 in 2020.



Secondary Senior competitors are students who are in Years 10, 11 and 12 in 2020.

All horses and ponies must be four years of age or over at time of entry. Horses' ages are assessed from 1 August of the year of birth.

Number of Classes

All classes require a minimum of 3 entries for the class to be run.

REFUND POLICY

Withdrawal of entries prior to the closing date of entries will receive a refund of the discipline class entry fee, stabling fee including bond, camping fee, ground fee less a \$50.00 administration fee.

Any withdrawal of a horse/rider after close of class entries for any reason/medical/veterinary grounds or are classed as being unfit to compete, shall be refunded 50% of class entry fees, 100% of stabling and camping fees less a \$50.00 administration fee. This will be refunded only if a medical/veterinary certificate is received within 48 hours of the notification.

Class entry, stabling and camping fees will NOT be refunded after the bump in of competition -1:00 pm on Wednesday 25th November 2020.

Dress

Riders must wear their school shirt and tie with school jumper, light coloured jodhpurs and smooth soled boots (refer to discipline rules for boots). Blazers/jackets will not be permitted. Gloves are compulsory for Dressage classes. Gaiters and long boots may be worn for all disciplines **except** for Show Horse rider classes where top boots and/or gaiters can only be worn by competitors 18 years and over.







Gear Check

Discipline Rules relating to gear must be adhered to. If you are unsure, please ask at the office before you compete. Judges/TD have the right to eliminate a child if they compete in incorrect gear.

Rider Number

All horses will be allocated a Bridle number. The number must be worn on the left (near) side of the bridle or saddle cloth at all times. When the horse is not competing the bridle number must be attached to the halter. **Competitors are to provide their own number holders.**

Stabling and Camping Fees

- Stable \$35 per stable per horse per night plus \$84 bond per stable (refunded if the stable has been cleaned and swept out). If stables are oversubscribed, preference will be given to those travelling from outside the Sydney metropolitan area.
- Admin Bedding Fee Shavings \$15 per bale (minimum of 5 bales per horse must be purchased – recommended amount of shavings is 8 bales)
- Additional bedding may be purchased on nominate when entering.
- Accommodation Limited cabins are available for the duration of the event. \$45 per night. (Linen, pillows and blankets are not provided)
- Camping Site- \$30 per site per day all powered
- Tack rooms- \$25.per day

Other Fees

Day Stay Fee - \$13 will be charged (per day) for each horse not stabled on the grounds.

Admin Fee - \$20 per rider will be charged

The fee assists in covering the cost of the Paramedic and, additional volunteers that are required with the current restrictions.



Arrival

Competitors/Horses arrivals will be from 1pm Wednesday 25th November 2020.

Protests/Queries

No competitor or parent is to directly approach any judge, steward, course builder or any other official before, during or after the competition with disputes or complaints.

All queries must be made in writing to the organising committee within 30 minutes of the final results being posted publicly. A formal protest requires a deposit of **\$200** that will be forfeited unless the protest is upheld.

All objections must be made in writing at the Event office to be considered by the Ground Jury. The decision of the Ground Jury will be final.

General questions can be asked in relation to errors and in relation to running the event. These may be directed to the event office only.

Bicycles and Motorised Bikes and Scooters

The grounds of SIEC are public roads and road rules apply. Bicycles must not be ridden without a helmet.

Golf Buggies and other motorised equipment must be conditionally registered to be used at SIEC. Vehicles of any kind are not permitted on the cross-country track.

Dogs

Dogs must always be kept on a lead and you must clean up after your dog.

Image Consent

By entering this event you give your consent to Equestrian NSW to copy or reproduce images of yourself, competitor as ENSW may determine, without acknowledgement of yourself and without your entitlement to any remuneration or compensation now or in the future. The images may be used by ENSW in multimedia productions, publications, brochures and on the website to promote a range of initiatives.





Liability

Riders and/or owners whose entries have been accepted will undertake to indemnify the Organising Committee against all claims, losses, suits and damages made against or suffered by the Organising body by reason of any negligent act or omission on the part of any rider, trainer or attendant whilst attending riding or otherwise handling a horse, and agrees that act or omission on the part of such rider or attendant found in any action against the organising body to be negligent shall be deemed to have been negligent for the purpose of any claim under this indemnity.

Biosecurity

Equestrian NSW has a legal obligation under Workplace Health and Safety legislation to provide a safe competition. Welfare of our horses is also the founding principle under FEI and Equestrian Australia rules.

Hendra vaccination will not be a condition of entry for the 2020 Schoolies Champs. In the unlikely event of a biosecurity incident, the Biosecurity Manager will implement our event biosecurity plan. Our intention is to ensure that all horses can be treated, but the response will depend on the individual circumstances. All costs to do this will be borne by the horse owner/rider. Movement restrictions may be applied, in which case participants will be responsible for the care, maintenance and cost of their horses and themselves, including bedding, vets and personal needs.

Entries will be accepted on condition that riders/owners agree to waive any right to seek compensation of any type from Equestrian NSW, Sydney International Equestrian Centre, or any of their officers, servants or agents for any loss, injury or other damage arising in any way whatsoever, directly or indirectly from the presence of any virus in any horse or person attending the event or from any person or animal contracting any illness or disability, whether directly or indirectly or howsoever otherwise.

EA Policies

This Equestrian New South Wales (ENSW) event is governed by the Equestrian Australia (EA) General Regulations, applicable EA Sports Rules and all relevant

Class Description:

Handler: Judged on the rider's ability to present their horse/pony on the ground.

Best Presented: Judged on clean, neat and tidy appearance of horse, rider and saddlery. Judged

mounted in ring - no workout required.

Rider: Judged on the position and riding ability of the rider.

Open Hack: Judged on the horses' confirmation, manners, paces and education.

Hunter Hack: For horses with more bone substance, judged on horse's confirmation, manners, paces and education.

NOTE: Riders are only eligible to compete in Open Hack OR Hunter Hack. NOT both classes.

Rider is to nominate prior to the event.

Pairs: Pair of riders competing in same ring

Saddlery

- Horse/ponies competing in the Working Hunter section must have snaffle bridles. Martingales are not permitted.
- Browbands may be school coloured, those in hunter classes will not be penalised.
- Whips are to be a maximum length of 75cm.

Ribbons

Placings 1st to 6th will be awarded on the ring.

Eventing: Eventing entries must have at least one MER, for EvA 60cm and above 10 days prior to the competition, at the level entered.

EvA 45cm Competitors will need to provide evidence to show the horse and rider combination are capable to jump in a large open area. Results from previous competitions (EA affiliated club, show, pony club or Interschool) in the last 12 months and/or clinics and coaches they are currently training with.

All combinations will have their results assessed.

Eventing Rules can be found at the Equestrian NSW website – <u>www.nsw.equestrian.org.au</u>. Horses competing in EvA95cm and above must have full EA horse registration with a current Eventing competition licence.

(The Entry fee includes the compulsory \$14 rider levy paid to Eventing NSW)

Results will be verified and entries that don't comply may not be accepted.

Jumping Competitions – each class will consist of an A2 and AM5

Primary 45 cm and Primary and Secondary 60cm classes with be to Optimum time.

Individual phase ribbons will be presented at the conclusion of each phase at the ring.
